To be granted access to the K-TRACS database, you must register online and **this form must be filled out in its entirety and must be signed.** You may then upload this form to your account. If you don't have access to a scanner to be able to upload it yourself, you may fax it at the number above. Once this form is uploaded, the K-TRACS office will verify your information. Completion of this form or your online registration does not guarantee approval.

After you receive your account information, you may begin requesting reports. **Be sure to keep your password in a safe place and do not share your login information with anyone.** If you have any questions or need assistance in accessing the K-TRACS system, please feel free to contact the Kansas Board of Pharmacy at (785) 296-6547 or pmpadmin@ks.gov.
