

K-TRACS Prescriber E-Recap (PERx) FAQs:

Q: How do I change my healthcare specialty if it appears to be incorrect?

A: Within [K-TRACS](#), click User Profile, then click My Profile. You will find the option to change your healthcare specialty on this page.

Q: What if I have multiple healthcare specialties selected?

A: The Prescriber Report will compare your prescribing activity against other prescribers who share the same primary healthcare specialty. On the My Profile page, your primary healthcare specialty is designated by a crown icon in the upper left.

Q: What if my healthcare specialty isn't listed?

A: Please choose the healthcare specialty closest to yours.

Q: How can I view a list of my prescriptions that were included in my PERx?

A: Within [K-TRACS](#), click RxSearch, then click MyRx. Enter the date range of the prescriber report and select the DEA number associated with your PERx. This will allow you to see a full list of prescriptions that were included within the prescriber report metrics.

Q: Why will I get this?

A: The Kansas Board of Pharmacy is a recipient of the 2017 Harold Rogers Grant, which includes this K-TRACS enhancement on a quarterly basis for two years. The goal of PERx is to provide personal metrics to individual prescribers regarding their actual and recent prescribing practices, as well as a comparison to peers in the same healthcare specialty.

Q: Does my regulatory board or my supervisor see the PERx?

A: No. The report is provided to the prescriber as an informational tool. The reports are not provided to the regulatory boards.

Q: Does everyone get a PERx?

A: All K-TRACS prescribers that have provided a healthcare specialty and have prescribed opioids in the reporting time period will receive a quarterly PERx.

Q: What if I believe that there is an error on my prescription history?

A: If you believe that one or more of these prescriptions are incorrect, you may contact the dispensing pharmacy for additional details about the prescription in question. If you believe that there may be fraudulent activity associated with your DEA, please contact pmpadmin@ks.gov.
