



4. In an investigative report dated July 12, 2006, James Kinderknecht, R.Ph., a Board Inspector, provided documentation of sixty-five (65) new prescriptions from Parker's Pharmacy that were determined to be fraudulent. [Exhibit 3].

5. In an investigative report dated August 8, 2006, James Kinderknecht, R.Ph., a Board Inspector, provided documentation of information received from Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas that identified twenty-one (21) members who were billed for sixty-one (61) medications not dispensed by Parker's Pharmacy. [Exhibit 4].

6. In an investigative report dated June 16, 2006, James Kinderknecht, R.Ph., a Board Inspector, provided documentation of the Medicaid billing practices of Parker's Pharmacy from 2003 to May 23, 2006. [Exhibit 5].

7. In a summary report dated August 8, 2006, James Kinderknecht, R.Ph., a Board Inspector, summarized his investigative reports and opined that a large percentage of Parker's Pharmacy business was fraudulent. [Exhibit 6].

## II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND FACT

8. For a number of years, Jay Parker, R.Ph., of Parker's Pharmacy created numerous fraudulent prescriptions and fraudulently submitted claims for payment for those fraudulent prescriptions.

9. Parker's Pharmacy violated the Kansas Pharmacy Law as specified in Count I of the Petition to Revoke or Suspend the Registration of Parker's Pharmacy. As a result, the registration of Parker's Pharmacy may be revoked or suspended pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(e)(1).

10. Parker's Pharmacy violated the Kansas Pharmacy Law as specified in Count II of the Petition to Revoke or Suspend the Registration of Parker's Pharmacy. As a result, the

registration of Parker's Pharmacy may be revoked or suspended pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(e)(3).

### III. FINAL ORDER

Based upon the evidence introduced at the hearing held September 12, 2006 and the foregoing findings and conclusions, the registration of Parker's Pharmacy to operate a pharmacy in Kansas (Kansas registration number 2-05080) is hereby revoked.

Parker's Pharmacy is hereby assessed an administrative fine in the amount of Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.00).

Parker's Pharmacy shall sell all drugs remaining in its inventory to another registrant, or the drugs shall be destroyed, within two (2) weeks of the effective date of this Final Agency Order. If the registrant is to destroy any drug, such drug shall be destroyed in the presence of a Board representative.

Within fifteen (15) days after service of this Final Agency Order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.




