**AGENCY ORDER**

QUEEN'S PRICE CHOPPER PHARMACY is currently licensed as a pharmacy in the State of Kansas by reason of the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") having issued license no. 2-08955. At all times relevant hereto, the Respondent has held a current license to operate a pharmacy in the State of Kansas.

The Board has received certain information, has investigated and has determined that there are reasonable grounds to believe that the Respondent has operated in a manner that violates the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1626 *et seq.*

After considering the foregoing, the Board's Investigative Member, in accordance with the authority granted to her by the Board, enters the following agency order.

**I. FINDINGS OF FACT**

For purposes of this order, the Board's Investigation Member makes the following findings of fact:

1. The Board has previously issued Respondent license number

2-08955 which entitles it to function as a pharmacy in the State of Kansas ("Respondent's Registration").

2. That on May 17, 2007 a routine inspection was conducted whereby it was discovered that the pharmacy was operating without a pharmacist in charge. That the licensee had notified the Board office that Irene Gasser, R.Ph. was no longer the PIC effective February 4, 2007. The Board has never received any paperwork naming a new PIC after Ms. Gasser.

## **II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND FACT**

For purposes of this order, the Board's Investigation member makes the following conclusions of law and fact:

1. That the Respondent was originally issued a license number on December 19, 1997 pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1643.

2. That pursuant to K.A.R. 68-1-2a(b) each pharmacy or registrant that operates for more than 30 days without a designated pharmacist in charge is in violation of K.S.A. 65-1627(e).

3. That K.S.A. 65-1627 (e) states that the Board may revoke, suspend, place in a probationary status or deny a renewal of the registration of the pharmacy upon a finding that (1) such pharmacy has operated in such manner that violations of the provisions of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or of the rules and regulations of the board have occurred in connection therewith.
