STIPULATION OF FINDING OF FACT AND ORDER

This matter comes before the State Board of Pharmacy of the State of Kansas, this 56th day of August, 1994.

The State Board of Pharmacy appears by Hoyt Kerr, President and Presiding Officer; Glen Mathis, Vice-President; Dana Creitz, Pharmacist; Monte Baugher, Pharmacist; Charlotte Brock, Pharmacist; and Dr. Margaret Young, Consumer Representative. Also appearing are Tom C. Hitchcock, Executive Secretary, and the attorney for the Board, Dana W. Killinger. Jeffrey A. Clark does not appear personally, but appears by having read this Stipulation and accepting its terms by having executed the verification of this document.

Jeffrey A. Clark states that he has been advised of his procedural rights under the Pharmacy Practice Act and Administrative Procedure Act, wherein Jeffrey A. Clark has the right to a formal hearing, a right to be represented by counsel, call witnesses on his behalf, cross-examine the Board's witnesses and other procedural rights.

Jeffrey A. Clark further states that no issue of fact exists and wishes to stipulate to the following findings of fact and accepts the order of the State Board of Pharmacy, to-wit:

1. That Jeffrey A. Clark, License No. 1-11497 acknowledges that he understands the various rights and privileges afforded him by law, including the right to appear and be represented by legal counsel, the right to have all charges against him proven upon the record by competent and substantial evidence; the right to cross-examine any witnesses appearing at the hearing against him; and a hearing before the State Board of Pharmacy. Being aware of these rights provided him by operation of law, Jeffrey A. Clark, knowingly and voluntarily waives each and every one of these rights, and freely enters into this Joint Stipulation of Facts, and waives hearing before the State Board of Pharmacy.

2. That Jeffrey A. Clark is a licensed pharmacist in the State of Kansas, having License No. 1-11497.

3. That Jeffrey A. Clark and the California State Board of Pharmacy have entered an Order sanctioning the license of Jeffrey A. Clark, Exhibit A, attached herein.


4. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(12) the State Board of Pharmacy of the State of Kansas has the power and

authority to revoke, suspend, place on probation or deny the license renewal of said Jeffrey A. Clark, Jr.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Jeffrey A. Clark, License No. 1-11497, be placed on probation for a period of Three (3) years retroactive and commencing April 26, 1994. Should the said Jeffrey A. Clark violate any of the conditions placed on him by the California Board or the California Board revoke the license of Jeffrey A. Clark then the Kansas State Board of Pharmacy may review this Order and impose any sanction it shall deem appropriate.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT Jeffrey A. Clark, not be the Pharmacist in Charge at a Kansas licensed pharmacy without approval of the Board. The Licensee shall not serve as a preceptor during the period of probation.
