Interact

Prescribers and pharmacists may use a 24/7, web-accessible, secure database of controlled substance prescriptions for Kansas patients.

Inform

K-TRACS helps clinical decision-making by providing patient's controlled substance prescription history which results in better outcomes and can ultimately save lives.

Improve

Use of K-TRACS can improve patient care, safety, education, and outcomes through detection, prevention, and intervention while preserving access for patients with legitimate medical needs.

Additional Features



Prescribers of controlled substances receive a quarterly report containing vital information from K-TRACS regarding their own prescribing history and behavior. Only the prescriber has access to this report.

INTEGR_x8 provides interoperability services for all prescribers and pharmacists in Kansas to access K-TRACS through their electronic health records system by enabling a single sign-on for access to a patient's medical record and prescription history. This improves ease of access, patient support and engagement, and care coordination.

INTEGR_x8 is paid for by a KDHE/CDC grant through August 31, 2019.

PMP InterConnect® facilitates the sharing of data between 47 states, including Kansas. It allows participating state data to be linked providing a more effective means of combating drug diversion and abuse nationwide.

Advisory Committee

Composed of prescribers and pharmacists from various healthcare disciplines, the Committee is tasked with advising the program and reviewing data for purposes of identifying patterns and activity of concern and making necessary notifications and referrals to protect the public. The Committee also sets the threshold for identifying "doctor shoppers," currently defined as patients that visited at least five prescribers and filled prescriptions in at least five pharmacies in a 90-day period.

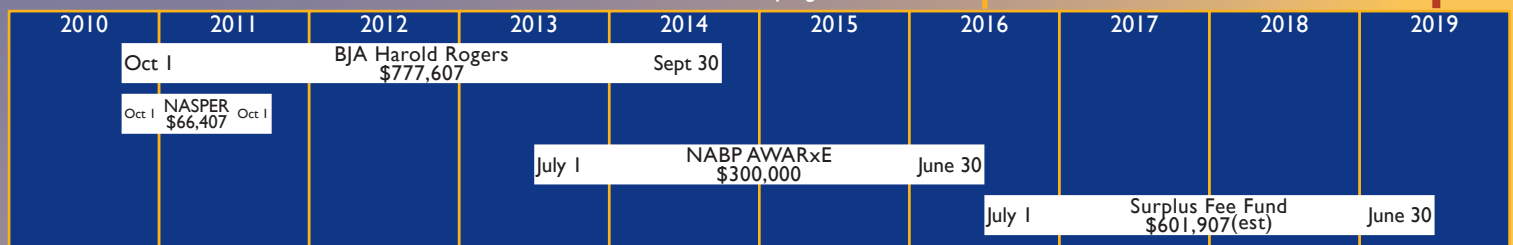

- The Advisory Committee and Governor’s Task Force recommend permanent state general funding for program sustainability.
- The Board of Pharmacy is responsible for K-TRACS oversight and management and will continue to pursue new grant opportunities for necessary enhancement or expansion.
- Kansas law prohibits charging prescribers or pharmacists any fee for program operation or use.
- Authorizing statutes K.S.A. 65-1681 et seq.
