II. Criteria Review and Vote	<p>Mrs. Lori Haskett, KBOP, told the committee there had been two responses from stakeholder regarding the criteria review. The first one was regarding 90 MME's and the second regarding Law Enforcement.</p> <p>Kathleen Lippert, Executive Director of the Kansas Board of Healing Arts spoke to the Committee regarding her agency developing a new review committee. The committee is called the Review Committee #4. It is made up of 3 doctors which would be the first to look at the cases sent to the board from the Advisory Committee. The Review Committee #4 decides whether the standard of care has been met before forwarding it on to the other review committees. Dr. Davison said he feels that this fills a niche so that practitioners won't be sent directly to law enforcement or the Board.</p> <p>Mrs. Haskett and Frank Papish discussed getting a committee together for the discussion of how the advisory committee could work best with Law Enforcement. The advisory committee asked that they report on their findings at the March meeting.</p>

Dr. McClintick seconded and motion carried.</p> <p>Case K19-002 and K19-003 A motion was made by Mr. Coble to send both cases to the Kansas Board of Healing Arts Review Committee #4. Mr. Godwin seconded, motion carried.</p> <p>Dr. McClintick moved that the committee go back into regular session. The motion was seconded by Ms. Mansfield, motion carried.</p> <p>Ms. Mansfield moved that the committee go back into closed session until 11:30 am. Mr. Coble seconded, and motion carried.</p> <p>Case K19-004 Ms. Mansfield made a motion to send a letter to the provider giving them 60 days to respond. Dr. McClintick seconded and motion carried.</p> <p>Case K19-005 The committee decided to look again at the February meeting to see if patterned behavior had continued.</p>
