**SUMMARY ORDER**

NOW on this 20 day of February, 2018 comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Accredo Health Group, Inc. (22-02552) (“Respondent”).

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board’s Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the investigation materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The Board has previously issued Respondent Registration No. 22-02552 which entitles Respondent to operate as a non-resident pharmacy in the State of Kansas (“Respondent’s Registration”).

2. On December 11, 2017, the address of Respondent’s facility was changed from 201 Great Circle Rd, Nashville, TN 37228 to 41 Rachel Drive, Suite 1, Nashville, TN 37214, effective immediately.

3. On January 25, 2018, the Board received from Respondent a Form BA-22 Non-Resident Pharmacy Registration Application, notifying of the change in address, and applying for a new non-resident pharmacy registration under the new address.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, the Board may assess a civil fine not to exceed \$5,000, after notice and an opportunity to be heard, to any registrant for violation of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any other rules or regulations of the state board of pharmacy.

5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 68-3-6(b), permit holders must submit change in address information within 30 days after any change in that information.

6. Respondent's failure to submit the complete change of address application to the Board until January 25, 2018 – 15 days past the January 10, 2018 deadline – is a violation pursuant to K.S.A. 68-3-6(b).

#### ORDER

The Board finds and concludes that Respondent's conduct, as described above, violates the Act and such conduct warrants the imposition of a fine pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, in the amount of \$500.00. Respondent has 30 days from the date of this order to pay the full \$500.00.

#### NOTICES

The Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

1. The Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.


3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:
