#### **SUMMARY ORDER**

NOW, on this 26th day of January 2022, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Old Town Pharmacy ("Respondent"), and its Kansas nonresident pharmacy registration renewal application.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, et seq., and in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, et seq., the Board enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions, and order:

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Board previously issued Respondent Registration No. 22-44829 which entitled Respondent to operate as a nonresident pharmacy in the State of Kansas through June 30, 2021, at which point Respondent's registration expired for nonrenewal.
- 2. On July 28, 2021, the Board received Respondent's application for late renewal of its pharmacy registration in the State of Kansas ("Respondent's Application").
- 3. On August 13, 2021, in conjunction with Respondent's Application, Respondent provided copies of prescription records for products shipped to Kansas patients between July 1, 2021 and July 28, 2021 (27 unique days). Respondent reported shipping 18 prescriptions into Kansas

during the period.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, the Board may assess a civil fine not to exceed \$5,000, after notice and an opportunity to be heard, to any registrant for violation of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any other rules or regulations of the state board of pharmacy.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1657(f), the Board may take action against any the registration of any nonresident pharmacy on any ground that would authorize the Board to take action against a pharmacy under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.
- 3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(e)(1), the Board may take action against the application of any pharmacy upon a finding that the applicant has violated the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any regulation adopted by the Board.
- 4. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1657(a), it shall be unlawful for any nonresident pharmacy to ship, mail or deliver prescription drugs or devices to a Kansas patient without first obtaining a registration from the Board.
- 5. Respondent operated a nonresident pharmacy in Kansas without a valid registration from the Board for 27 days from July 1, 2021 to July 28, 2021.
- 6. Respondent's act of operating a nonresident pharmacy in Kansas with an expired registration is a violation of K.S.A. 65-1657(a) and is a basis to take action against Respondent's Application pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1657(f).

## **ORDER**

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Respondent's Application is hereby GRANTED subject to payment of a fine in the amount of \$1,540. Respondent has 30 days from the date of this order to pay the fine.

**NOTICES** 

Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

1. Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure

Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414,

Topeka, KS 66612-1231, within 15 days after service of this Order. If the outcome of the hearing

is adverse to Respondent, costs of the proceedings shall be charged to Respondent.

2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order

of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within 15 days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for

reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial

review of a final agency order, pursuant to K.S.A. 77-613. The agency officer designated to receive
