#### **SUMMARY ORDER**

NOW, on this 16th day of February 2023, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of John Calia ("Respondent").

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, et seq., and in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, et seq., the Board enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions, and order:

## FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Board has previously issued Respondent License No. 1-12621 which entitles Respondent to function as a pharmacist in the State of Kansas ("Respondent's Registration").
- 2. On March 10, 2022, the Board received a consumer complaint regarding a prescription dispensing error at Price Chopper Pharmacy (the "Pharmacy") that resulted in patient harm. The consumer indicated that the patient had to go to the emergency room with heart attack symptoms and, on December 26, 2021, upon reviewing the pills in the prescription bottle for the patient's methotrexate 2.5mg the consumer discovered amphetamine 30mg.
- 3. The patient's medication profile shows that the patient was prescribed methotrexate 2.5mg and the prescription was dispensed on December 21, 2021. Respondent input, dispensed, and

verified the prescription.

4. On December 26, 2021, an incident report was prepared by Respondent regarding the prescription dispensing error and Respondent adjusted the perpetual inventory for amphetamine 30mg by 32 pills after an audit.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, in addition to any other penalty the Board may assess a civil fine not to exceed \$5,000, after notice and an opportunity to be heard, to any registrant for violation of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any other rules or regulations of the state board of pharmacy.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(6), the Board may take action against a pharmacist upon a finding that the licensee is found by the board to have filled a prescription not in strict accordance with the directions of the practitioner or a mid-level practitioner.
- 3. In dispensing amphetamine 30mg in lieu of the correct, written prescription for methotrexate 2.5mg, Respondent failed to fill the patient's prescription in strict conformity with the directions of a practitioner or mid-level practitioner, in violation of K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(6).

### **ORDER**

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Respondent is ordered to pay a fine to the Board in the amount of \$500. Respondent has 30 days from the date of this order to pay the fine by check or money order.

Furthermore, Respondent shall complete three hours of additional ACPE-approved continuing education on medication errors and shall provide proof of completion to the Board within 60 days of the date of this Order. If Respondent is not already signed up for the NABP CPE monitor (free version), Respondent shall create an NABP CPE monitor profile and shall ensure

that proof of completion of these penalty hours and all future required continuing education

appears in the CPE monitor. Completion of penalty hours shall not count toward Respondent's

next continuing education renewal requirement.

**NOTICES** 

Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

1. Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure

Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414,

Topeka, KS 66612-1231, within 15 days after service of this Order. If the outcome of the hearing

is adverse to Respondent, costs of the proceedings shall be charged to Respondent.

2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order

of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within 15 days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for

reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial

review of a final agency order, pursuant to K.S.A. 77-613. The agency officer designated to receive
