STIPULATION OF FINDING OF FACT AND ORDER

This matter comes before the State Board of Pharmacy  
for the State of Kansas this 4<sup>th</sup> day of November,  
1990.

The State Board of Pharmacy appears by Barbara Renick,  
President and Presiding Officer, Karla Kneebone, Vice-  
President; Kathleen Mahanna, Pharmacist; Hoyt Kerr, Pharmacist;  
Dana Creitz, Pharmacist; and Laurence Hendricks, Consumer  
Representative. Also appearing are Tom Hitchcock, Executive  
Secretary, and the attorney for the Board, Dana W. Killinger.  
The Defendant, Gary G. Coleman, appears in person.

Defendant states that he has been advised of his  
procedural rights under the Pharmacy Practice Act and  
Administrative Procedure Act, wherein Counsel for the  
Board advised Defendant of his rights to a formal hearing  
wherein he had a right to be represented by counsel, call

witnesses on his behalf, cross examine plaintiffs witnesses and other procedural rights. Counsel further advised Defendant of the statutory sections of the law which were allegedly violated and the statute giving the Board jurisdiction in the matter. Whereupon Defendant waived his right to formal hearing.

Defendant further states that no issue of fact exists and wishes to stipulate to the following findings of fact and accepts the order of the State Board of Pharmacy, to-wit:

1. That Defendant, Gary G. Coleman, is a licensed pharmacist in the State of Kansas whose license is Number 8406.
2. That Defendant, Gary G. Coleman, was Pharmacist in Charge of Northside Pharmacy, Registration Number 6684 from sometime in 1985 until February 1, 1990.
3. That on or about July 6, 1989, Prescription Number 608284 for Cecile Hood was filled with Haldol 5 mg. by another licensed pharmacist employed at Northside Pharmacy when Dr. Shelton had written said prescription for Haldol .5 mg. This constitutes a violation of K.S.A. 65-1637(a).
4. That said pharmacy operation, on occasions, has been observed to have pre-packaged prescription drugs without the proper labeling in conformity with K.A.R. 68-7-16.

5. That due to the frequency of the occurrences set forth in Paragraph 4, this constitutes in addition to the specific statutory and regulatory violations, also a violation of K.S.A. 65-1626(aa)(2)(1989 Supp.).

6. That the Defendant has failed to report to the State Board of Pharmacy office, his new residential address within thirty (30) days as required by K.S.A. 65-1633.

7. That the Defendant has failed to comply with the statutory requirements imposed by the State upon pharmacists licensed by the State.

8. That the State Board of Pharmacy of the State of Kansas pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(6)&(8) has jurisdiction and power to revoke, suspend or place on probation said Gary G. Coleman.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Gary G. Coleman, License Number 8406 be:

1. Placed on probation for a period of one year from this date.

2. That during said probationary period Gary G. Coleman may not serve as Pharmacist in Charge or as preceptor.


3. That he take the pharmacy law examination at the Board of Pharmacy office in Topeka and pass with a

score of 75% within thirty (30) days of this Order.




