STIPULATION IN LIEU OF FORMAL HEARING

This matter comes before the State Board of Pharmacy for the State of Kansas, this The day of Deplowhere 1991.

The State Board of Pharmacy appears by Hoyt Kerr,
President and Presiding Officer, Dana Creitz, Vice-President;
Kathleen Mahanna, Pharmacist; Barbara Renick, Pharmacist;
Charlotte Brock, Pharmacist; and Margaret Young, Consumer
Representative. Also appearing are Tom C. Hitchcock,
Executive Secretary, and the attorney for the Board, Dana
W. Killinger.

Defendant states that he is aware of his procedural rights under the Pharmacy Practice Act and Administrative Procedure Act, wherein he has a right to a formal hearing,

a right to be represented by counsel, call witnesses on his behalf, cross examine plaintiffs witnesses and other procedural rights.

Defendant further states that there may exist sufficient evidence to bring formal proceedings against him by the Board for violations of 65-1627(a)(4) and wishes to stipulate to the following sanctions in lieu of the Board filing a formal Petition and bringing the matter to formal evidenciary hearing.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that John R. Egberts, License
No. 11624, be placed on probation for three years, commencing
April 1, 1991, on the following condition:

- (A) That the Defendant not violate any pharmacy law or regulation of the State of Kansas or the Federal Foods, Drug or Cosmetic Act or its regulations or the Controlled Substance Act or its regulations for the State of Kansas.
- (B) That Defendant is actively participating and cooperate in an impaired drug program in the State where residing and keep the Board and Etta Williams, Professional Advisory Services, Inc. 6005 Martway, Suite 100, Mission,

Kansas 66202, advised of such participation quarterly each year of probation. Such quarterly report shall state:

- (1) Complete and current residential address and telephone number of Defendant.
- (2) Name of current employer giving name, address and telephone number.
- (3) The name and address of the drug rehabilitation program Defendant is currently participating in and the name and address of the individual immediately responsible or who is acquainted with Defendant's case.
- (4) A log stating dates and places of all activities in which Defendant has participated in said drug rehabilitation program for that particular quarter.
- (5) Said report shall state in narrative form the status of activity of Defendant concerning drug rehabilitation for that particular quarter.
- (6) The first such quarterly report shall be filed November 1, 1991.
- (C) Should the Board find that Defendant has violated any of the above laws or regulations or conditions of probation during the period of probation, Defendant's

license may be revoked.
