SUMMARY ORDER

NOW, on this 25th day of July 2023, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Taylor Jacobson, ("Respondent").

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the investigation materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board has issued Respondent Pharmacy Technician Registration Number 14-115876 authorizing Respondent to perform the functions of a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Respondent's Registration").

2. On or about February 6, 2023, the Board received information regarding a criminal arrest of Respondent for the offense of patronizing a prostitute; hire a prostitute to engage in sexual act.

3. On February 6, 2023, the Board sent a letter to Respondent's address of record requesting a completed Personal History Form S-150 ("S-150"), as well as certified copies of the court pleadings from the case.

4. On March 6, 2023, the Board received the requested documents from Respondent, which indicated Respondent had entered into a 12-month diversion agreement in May 2023 for the criminal offense of "hiring a person selling sexual relations who is 18."

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.

2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3), the Board may place in a probationary status the license of any pharmacist who has been found guilty of unprofessional conduct.

3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1626(vvv)(7), unprofessional conduct means conduct likely to deceive, defraud or harm the public.

4. Respondent's criminal offense is unprofessional conduct and a basis to place Respondent's Registration in a probationary status pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3). Furthermore, Respondent has just entered into the 12-month diversion agreement, indicating that Respondent has not yet demonstrated rehabilitation from this offense.

<u>ORDER</u>

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Respondent's Registration is hereby placed on a 2-year probationary status. The terms of Respondent's probation are as follows:

- Respondent must notify the Board of any arrest or criminal charge within 10 days of the date of the arrest or charge;
- Respondent must notify the Board of any change in employment within 10 days of the change and obtain Board approval for the change;
- Respondent must respond to the Board's regular check-in requests;
- Respondent must inform employers of the probationary status of Respondent's Registration;
- Respondent must obtain the signature of Respondent's pharmacist-in-charge (PIC) documenting knowledge of Respondent's probationary status to the Board; and
- Respondent must comply with all rules and regulations of the Pharmacy Practice Act.

NOTICES

Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

1. Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order. 2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is
