SUMMARY ORDER

NOW, on this 29th day of July 2021, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Jacob Jamron, (“Applicant”), for the renewal of his Kansas Pharmacist License No. 1-110653.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board’s Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the renewal application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusion, and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On June 4, 2021, the Board received Applicant’s renewal application for licensure as a pharmacist in the State of Kansas (“Applicant’s Renewal”).

2. Applicant answered “YES” to the following questions on his renewal: *Have you ever been the subject of any disciplinary action taken against a professional or occupational license or registration?* and *Has there been a denial, revocation, suspension, voluntary surrender, or any other disciplinary action taken by the State of Kansas or any other jurisdiction against any professional or occupational license or registration held by you?* The renewal

instructed that if Applicant answered “YES”, he must attach a Form S-150: Personal History (“S-150”).

3. In his S-150, which included certified court documents, Applicant detailed that his license to practice pharmacy in Virginia had been disciplined (“the Virginia Discipline”) in an order issued by that state’s Board of Pharmacy effective November 5, 2020. The Virginia Discipline arose out of a nonresident pharmacy license application for a pharmacy owned by Applicant, where an unauthorized and falsified date led to a violation, allegedly committed by an employee Applicant had tasked with completing and submitting said nonresident application. Applicant had conducted his own internal investigation into the violation, had terminated the involved employee, but was ordered by the Virginia Discipline to pay a fine and stand reprimanded.

4. The Board had no knowledge of the Virginia Discipline, nor had received any notification of such, until Applicant’s Renewal was received by the Board on June 4, 2021.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(8), the Board may limit or deny a renewal of any license of any pharmacist upon a finding that the licensee has violated any of the provisions of the Pharmacy Act of the State of Kansas or any rule and regulation adopted by the Board pursuant to the provision of such pharmacy act.

2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(12), the Board may limit or deny a renewal of any license of any pharmacist upon a finding that the licensee has had a license to practice pharmacy limited or has had other disciplinary action taken by the proper licensing authority of another state, a certified copy of the record of the action of the other jurisdiction being conclusive evidence thereof.

3. Pursuant to K.A.R. 68-7-25(c), each pharmacist licensed by the Board shall notify the Board in writing, within 30 days of occurrence, of any limitation or other disciplinary action taken by another jurisdiction against any pharmacist license held by the Board's licensee.

4. Applicant had 30 days to notify the Board of his Virginia Discipline effective November 5, 2020, or until December 5, 2020.

5. Applicant failed to notify the Board of his Virginia Discipline until the Board's June 4, 2021 receipt of Applicant's Renewal.

6. Applicant violated K.A.R. 68-7-25(c) by failing to notify the Board of his Virginia Discipline within 30 days of its occurrence.

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's Renewal application for his continued pharmacist licensure is hereby GRANTED, SUBJECT TO A \$500.00 FINE for his violation of the Pharmacy Practice Act of the State of Kansas, to be paid to the Board within 30 days from the effective date of this order.

NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

1. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is
