SUMMARY ORDER

NOW, on this 20th day of May 2020, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Amanda Moore ("Respondent").

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the investigation materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board has previously issued Respondent License No. 1-16702 which entitles Respondent to practice as a pharmacist in the State of Kansas.
2. On April 12, 2020, Respondent resigned as Pharmacist-in-Charge ("PIC") from Freedom Behavioral Hospital of Topeka, effective immediately.
3. On May 15, 2020, the Board received a Change in PIC Form BA-50, notifying of the resignation of Respondent as PIC effective April 12, 2020.
4. On or about May 15, 2020, the Board processed the PIC change.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, the Board may assess a civil fine not to exceed \$5,000, after notice and an opportunity to be heard, to any registrant for violation of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any other rules or regulations of the state board of pharmacy.

2. Pursuant to K.A.R. 68-2-5, each pharmacist shall notify the board in writing within five days of ceasing to serve as the pharmacist-in-charge at a pharmacy or registrant required to have a pharmacist-in-charge. The notice shall include the pharmacist's name, the name and address of the pharmacy or registrant, and the date the pharmacist ceased to serve as the pharmacist-in-charge.

3. Respondent had five days to notify the Board of Respondent's resignation as PIC effective April 12, 2020, or until April 17, 2020.

4. Respondent failed to notify the Board of her resignation.

5. Respondent violated K.A.R. 68-2-5 by failing to notify the Board of Respondent's resignation as PIC within five days.

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Respondent is ordered to pay a fine to the Board. Because Respondent has not to date provided notification to the Board, the total fine is \$200. Respondent has 30 days from the date of this order to pay the fine.

NOTICES

The Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

1. The Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:


