SUMMARY ORDER OF DENIAL

NOW on this **6** day of June, 2017 comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Ankeyta White, ("Applicant"), for application for a Kansas pharmacy technician application.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, et seq., and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, et seq., the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order of Denial in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Investigative Member makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. Applicant was initially granted license number 14-11873 to practice as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas.
- 2. On August 26, 2015, the Board issued final order of revocation to Applicant due to Applicant repeatedly violating the terms of her Stipulation and Consent Order.
 - a. Applicant failed to complete mandatory drug tests on two occasions.

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- b. The Board requested Applicant appear for an administrative hearing to discuss the drug test violation.
- c. Applicant failed to appear at the administrative hearing and was held in default for failing to comply with the Stipulation and Consent Agreement.
- 3. On February 9, 2017, the Board received Applicant's application for

reinstatement after revocation.

4. Applicant failed to document any change in pattern of behavior from her past on

her application.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

5. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a

registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy

technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of

a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.

6. That pursuant to K.S.A. 1627(f). If such license, registration or permit is

revoked, such revocation shall be for all time, except that at any time after the expiration of one

year, application may be made for reinstatement of any license. Such application shall be

processed in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas administrative procedure act.

7. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2), the Board may deny the granting of a

license to a pharmacist if a licensee fails to show sufficient rehabilitation to warrant the public

trust.

8. That pursuant to 65-1627(a)(3), the Board may deny licensure to an applicant if

the licensee is found by the board to be guilty of unprofessional conduct.

In the Matter of Ankeyta White, No. 17-043 SUMMARY ORDER OF DENIAL Page 2 of 5 9. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1626(ccc)(7), unprofessional conduct is defined as

conduct likely to deceive, defraud or harm the public.

10. Applicant's failure to show rehabilitation after the course of previous

unprofessional conduct which resulted in the revocation of her tech registration is a basis to

deny Applicant's application pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2) and (a)(3).

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's

Application is hereby DENIED.

NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

11. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative

Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW

Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this

order.

12. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order denying Applicant's

Registration as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon

the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

13. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file

a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

14. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek

judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated
