According to KSA 65-1627h, the Board is required to recoup the costs of administrative hearings when the decision is adverse to the licensee. These costs may include charges for services rendered by the Board's disciplinary counsel, an administrative law judge, and, if applicable, a court reporter.

SUMMARY ORDER

NOW, on this 13th day of January, 2023, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of DaJiah Williams (“Respondent”).

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board’s Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board has previously issued Respondent Registration No. 24-114022 which entitles Respondent to practice as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas.
2. On Respondent’s pharmacy technician application, Respondent indicated she was hired to work in a pharmacy technician position at OptumRx, pharmacy registration number 2-10031 (“Pharmacy”).
3. On October 6, 2022, the Board received an email from the pharmacist-in-charge at Pharmacy indicating Respondent was employed with Pharmacy from approximately February 1, 2021 to August 24, 2021.

4. To date, the Board has not received any notice of change in employment from Respondent.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, the Board may assess a civil fine not to exceed \$5,000, after notice and an opportunity to be heard, to any registrant for violation of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any other rules or regulations of the state board of pharmacy.

2. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may take action on an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.

3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(8), the Board may take action against the license of any pharmacist upon a finding that the licensee has violated any of the provisions of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any rule and regulation adopted by the Board pursuant to the provisions of such pharmacy act.

4. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663(g), every registered pharmacy technician, within 30 days of obtaining new employment or ceasing employment as a pharmacy technician, shall notify the Board of the name and address of the new employer or cessation of employment

5. Respondent ceased to be employed by Pharmacy on or around August 24, 2021.

6. Since Respondent has failed to provide notice of change in employment to the Board in violation of K.S.A. 65-1663(g).

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Respondent is ordered to pay a fine to the Board in the amount of \$75 within 30 days.

NOTICES

Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

1. Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.
2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.
3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.
4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is
