AMENDED SUMMARY ORDER

NOW, on this 17th day of October 2022, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Nazsha Williams, ("Applicant"), for application for registration as a Kansas pharmacy technician.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, et seq., and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, et seq., the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Amended Summary Order in the abovecaptioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On January 18, 2022, the Board received Applicant's application for registration as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Applicant's Application"). However, the Board did not receive all required application documents until March 1, 2022.
- 2. Applicant answered "No" to the following question on her application: "Have you been charged with or convicted of (includes plea of guilty or no contest) a criminal offense or is there any criminal charge now pending against you (other than minor traffic violations) in any state or federal court whether or not a sentence was imposed, suspended, or diverted? This

includes misdemeanors." The application directs that if the applicant answers yes, the applicant must attach a Form S-150: Personal History ("Form S-150").

- 3. The Board received information regarding a June 2012 theft and possession of marijuana offense(s), a February 2013 DWI-alcohol offense, and a November 2019 driving while revoked/suspended offense for Applicant.
- 4. On March 3, 2022, the Board mailed Applicant a letter requesting a completed Form S-150, as well as certified copies of the court pleadings from each case.
- 5. On or about March 21, 2022, the Board received the requested documentation. Applicant's personal statement and court records documented that Applicant entered into a two-year probation for the 2013 DWI offense in addition to the other charges. Applicant accepted full responsibility for her actions and reported an active Missouri pharmacy technician registration.
- 6. On or about May 20, 2022, the Board issued a Summary Order granting Applicant's Application subject to a \$300 fine for a violation of K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1).
 - 7. To date, Applicant has not paid the fine and has not yet been issued a registration.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, the Board may assess a civil fine not to exceed \$5,000, after notice and an opportunity to be heard, to any registrant for violation of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any other rules or regulations of the state board of pharmacy.
- 2. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may take action on an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.

3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1), the Board may deny the application of any pharmacist upon a finding that the licensee has obtained, renewed or reinstated, or attempted to obtain, renew or reinstate, a license by false or fraudulent means, including misrepresentation of

a material fact.

4. Applicant's answer of "no" to the disciplinary question(s) on Applicant's

Application was a misrepresentation of material fact on an application and a basis to take action

against Applicant's Application as a violation of K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1).

5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3), the Board may take action against the license

of any pharmacist who has been found guilty of unprofessional conduct.

6. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1626(uuu), unprofessional conduct means conduct likely

to deceive or harm the public.

7. Applicant's criminal offense history are unprofessional conduct related to

substance use and is a basis to take action against Applicant's Application pursuant to K.S.A. 65-

1627(a)(3).

8. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(16), the licensee has violated or failed to

comply with any lawful order or directive of the board.

9. Applicant's failure to pay the required fine is a violation of K.S.A. 65-

1627(a)(16).

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's

Application for issuance of pharmacy technician registration is hereby DENIED.

NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

1. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure

Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414,

Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final

order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file

a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial

review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive
