I. Call to Order

Meeting called to order by Dr. Templeton at 9:03 AM.

II. Approval of Minutes

A motion was made by Mr. Godwin to approve the minutes and seconded by Dr. Templeton. Motion carried.

III. Staff Updates

Ms. Blasi gave the committee a legislative update. She explained that long term funding is a continuing issue with the K-TRACS Program. Ms. Blasi told the committee that the K-TRACS bill has not received a hearing and may not get one. She told the committee, if need be, the bill will be reintroduced next year. The Controlled Substance bill did get a hearing. The Opioid Litigation Fund is being put together by the Attorney General's office, and K-TRACS will be asking for some of that funding.

Mr. Schoech requested a 10-minute break at 10:20 AM.

Meeting was reconvened at 10:30 AM.

Ms. Donnelly reported on the new arrival at the K-TRACS office, Mr. Chandler Aronhalt.

Ms. Donaldson did a communication update for the committee. She did a presentation showing the best practices information she had put together. Dr. Long asked that the information be printed off and sent

out with letters from the K-TRACS Advisory Committee. Ms. Donaldson told the committee that Naloxone information would be going out over the next few months.

Ms. Kenton reported on a meeting between the Kansas Board of Healing Arts investigator and legal teams with the K-TRACS team. The team answered question by the Healing Arts employees regarding K-TRACS use. Ms. Kenton took questions asked to the committee regarding printing off patient profiles and adding them to medical records by prescribers. Mr. Coble suggest a banner be put across the top of the K-TRACS screen that this cannot be printed and put into records.

Ms. Donnelly did a presentation on Kansas data during and since the statewide stay-at-home order. She updated the committee on both the BJA grants and the CDC grant for the OD2A project. Ms. Donnelly said there is a possibility to working with KDADS on a new grant from SAMSHA.

IV. Closed Session

At 9:25 AM Dr. Long moved that the Advisory Committee go into closed session to review new cases investigated by Dr. Rice until 10:20 AM. Mr. Coble seconded, and the motion carried.

The meeting was called back to order by Mr. Schoech at 10:20 AM.

Case 21-003-Dr. Long moved the case be moved to the Kansas Board of Healing Arts for further investigation. Dr. Mansfield seconded; motion carried.

Case 21-001-Mr. Coble moved to send the providers letters who had seen the patient in the past 6 months. Mr. Schoech seconded; motion carried.

Case 21-002-Dr. Mansfield moved that a letter be sent to the prescriber and the supervising physician concerning the combination of agents and pattern of prescribing and remind both of the availability of K-TRACS. Dr Templeton seconded; motion carried.

V. Adjourn

Mr. Coble made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 11:21 AM. Dr. Templeton seconded the motion. Motion carried. The next meeting of the K-TRACS Advisory Committee is scheduled for April 16, 2021.
