#### I. Call to Order

Meeting was called to order by Mr. Schoech at 11:29 AM.

#### II. Approval of March Minutes

A motion was made by Mr. Godwin to approve minutes. Dr. Long seconded. Motion carried.

#### III. Announcements

Ms. Donaldson introduced two new staff members to the committee. Vanessa Rine has taken the position of Program Specialist. She will be working on pharmacy reporting requirements. Jehan DeDecker, R.Ph., has taken the education position, taking over the academic detailing. The office still has two positions open currently.

Ms. Donaldson reminded the committee they must do the online security training as it is an annual requirement.

Ms. Donaldson announced to the advisory committee that the July meeting would be in person, with a virtual option for those who could not attend in person. She told the committee there would be regulation changes to discuss that time.

#### IV. Legislative Update

Ms. Blasi updated the committee on what was happening in the current legislative session. She told the committee there were two bills related to K-TRACS, one in the House, the other in the Senate. She publicly thanked the stakeholders for their support.

#### V. Out-of-State Integration Request from Telehealth Provider

Ms. Kenton updated the committee on telehealth providers wanting integrated access to the system. The committee decision was to have the providers sign up for the K-TRACS portal and to not give them integrated access. Dr. Davison asked to have the policy in writing for telemedicine.

#### VI. Case Review-Closed Session

Dr. Estep moved the committee recess into executive session:

Case 22-002 Dr. McClintick moved to send the provider a letter asking him to explain and justify the patient's care. Dr. Templeton seconded. Mr. Heidrick abstained. Motion carried.

Case 22-003 Dr. Templeton moved to send a letter the human resources department of the company, so they are aware of issues within the company. Dr. Long seconded; motion carried.
