Discussion regarding 2011 Legislation:

HB 2120 Government Efficiency

HB 2136 Insurance Cost Sharing

HB 2182 Unused Medication:

Adds Nonresident mail order pharmacies to the statute permitting them to participate in the Unused Medication program. Hearing scheduled for Monday, 2/14/11, at 1:30, Room 784 Docking State Office Building.

HB 2098 PSE Scheduling

Board supports scheduling PSE. Hearing is scheduled for Wednesday, Feb 16 at 1:30 in Room 144 South.

SB 131 PSE Scheduling

HB 2023 Controlled Substances

Amended to match federal law.

SB 29 Controlled Substances

Amended to match federal law.

HB 2048 Drug Destruction

Board discussed problems with the bill. Board Exec to meet with sponsors.

HB 2049 K3 Bill

SB 99 Electronic Prescriptions

Hearing scheduled Feb10, 2011 at 1:30 in Senate Health.

Bill runs contrary to improving quality of care and lowering costs of prescription drugs. Prevents dose alerts and formulary messaging. These tools improve protections for patient. This bill is offered to protect brand name drugs. There are significant implications for safety edits. The impact on Medicaid to manage appropriate drug therapy would be impeded.

SB 91 Sexual Assault Survivors Right to Emergency Contraception

HB 2178 Military Spouses

This law would prevent Board from determining whether pharmacist had command of pharmacy laws. Board does not support this bill.

SB 51 Dispensing to Students

Bill using term dispensing related to school personnel. Request that this language be modified to indicate that school is not dispensing the drugs.

HB 2123 Transparency Act

HB 2129 Health Care Freedom

SB 134 License of ARNP

SB 138 Pharmacy Audit Integrity Act

Board requested that KPhA provide what involvement if any would be necessary of Board since the bill requires all final audits to be filed with the Board.

HB 2232 Drug Crimes

SB 132 Dental Hygienists Prescriptive Authority

Board opposes this bill because of the safety implications to patients. 18 hours of pharmacology does not provide enough experience for individual to prescribe drugs or

understand drug interactions and allergies. Places liability on dentist and pharmacist to make sure that prescription is safe to fill.

SB 133 HIE Technology and Exchange of Information

Karen Braman updated the Board on SB 133. She is the chairman of the committee working on health information technology.

SB 162 Disclosure by Real Estate Brokers

Methamphetamine production at residence that is being sold.

HB 2249 Bath Salts

Board reviewed the bill related to bath salts and supports bill.
