According to KSA 65-1627h, the Board is required to recoup the costs of administrative hearings when the decision is adverse to the licensee. These costs may include charges for services rendered by the Board's disciplinary counsel, an administrative law judge, and, if applicable, a court reporter.

SUMMARY ORDER

NOW on this 2nd day of February, 2024, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of John Barishman (“Respondent”).

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board’s Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the investigation materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Board has previously issued Respondent License No. 1-113898 which entitles Respondent to practice as a pharmacist in the State of Kansas.
2. On January 12, 2024, Respondent ceased to serve as Pharmacist-in-Charge (“PIC”) at Express Scripts Specialty Distribution Services, Inc..
3. On January 23, 2024, the Board received a Change in PIC Form BA-50, notifying the Board that Respondent had ceased to serve as PIC effective January 12, 2024. The BA-50 did not contain Respondent’s signature.
4. On or about January 24, 2024, the Board processed the PIC change.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, the Board may assess a civil fine not to exceed \$5,000, after notice and an opportunity to be heard, to any registrant for violation of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any other rules or regulations of the state board of pharmacy.

2. Pursuant to K.A.R. 68-1-9, each pharmacist shall submit to the Board, on a form provided by the Board, notice of ceasing to serve as the pharmacist-in-charge at a pharmacy or facility required to have a pharmacist-in-charge no later than five days after ceasing to serve as the pharmacist-in-charge.

3. Respondent had five days to notify the Board of Respondent's resignation as PIC effective January 12, 2024, or until January 17, 2024.

4. Respondent failed to notify the Board of Respondent's resignation as PIC. The Board only received notification from the facility and not until January 23, 2024 – eleven (11) days past the deadline.

5. Respondent violated K.A.R. 68-1-9 by failing to notify the Board of Respondent's resignation as PIC within five days.

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Respondent is ordered to pay a fine of \$500 to the Board within 30 days from the date of this Order.

NOTICES

The Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

1. The Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.


4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:
