If you disagree with the findings of fact, you have the right to request a hearing. Instructions for filing a written request are included under the "Notices" section of the order. Hearings are held before the full Board during their regularly scheduled quarterly meetings.

According to KSA 65-1627h, the Board is required to recoup the costs of administrative hearings when the decision is adverse to the licensee. These costs may include charges for services rendered by the Board's disciplinary counsel, an administrative law judge, and, if applicable, a court reporter.

**SUMMARY ORDER**

NOW, on this 27<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2023, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Kimberly Boaz, (“Applicant”), for application for reinstatement as a pharmacist licensed in the state of Kansas.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board’s Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The Board has previously issued Applicant License No. 1-14011 which entitled Respondent to practice as a pharmacist in the State of Kansas through June 30, 2023, at which point Applicant’s license expired for nonrenewal.
2. On August 23, 2023, the Board received Applicant’s application for reinstatement of her pharmacist license in the State of Kansas (“Applicant’s Application”).
3. Applicant disclosed to the Board that she worked as a pharmacist in Kansas on five separate occasions while her Kansas pharmacist license was expired: August 2<sup>nd</sup>, August 4<sup>th</sup>, August 7<sup>th</sup>, August 9<sup>th</sup>, and August 11<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, the Board may assess a civil fine not to exceed \$5,000, after notice and an opportunity to be heard, to any registrant for violation of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any other rules or regulations of the state board of pharmacy.

2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(8), the Board may take action against the license of any pharmacist upon a finding that the licensee has violated any of the provisions of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any regulation adopted by the Board.

3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1631(a), it shall be unlawful for any person to practice as a pharmacist in this state unless such person is licensed by the board as a pharmacist.

4. Applicant's act of working as a pharmacist in Kansas on five separate days while her license was expired was a violation of K.S.A. 65-1631(a), and is a basis for the Board to take action against Applicant's license pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(8).

## ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's Application is hereby GRANTED but Applicant is ordered to pay a fine to the Board in the amount of \$1,000. Applicant has 30 days from the date of this order to pay the fine and the license shall be issued upon receipt.

If Applicant is not already signed up for the NABP CPE monitor (free version), Applicant shall create an NABP CPE monitor profile and shall ensure that proof of completion of all future required continuing education appears in the CPE monitor.

## NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

1. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.




