### **SUMMARY ORDER**

NOW, on this \( \sum\_{\text{out}} \) day of April 2020, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Kasey Cavender, ("Applicant"), for application for registration as a Kansas pharmacy technician.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On December 9, 2019, the Board received Applicant's application for registration as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Applicant's Application").
- 2. Applicant answered "No" to the following question on her application: "Have you been charged with or convicted of (includes plea of guilty or no contest) a criminal offense or is there any criminal charge now pending against you (other than minor traffic violations) in any state or federal court whether or not a sentence was imposed, suspended, or diverted? This includes misdemeanors." The application directs that if the applicant answers yes, the applicant must attach a Form S-150: Personal History ("S-150").

- 3. The Board received information regarding December 2011 felony charges for criminal use of a financial card and theft of property or services.
- 4. On December 24, 2019, the Board mailed Applicant a letter requesting a completed S-150, as well as certified copies of the court pleadings supporting the case.
- 5. The Board subsequently received court documents and a brief statement which included no explanation of the incident or charges.
- 6. On February 3, 2020, the Board mailed Applicant a second letter requesting a more thorough S-150 detailing the incident and charges.
- 7. On or about March 4, 2020, the Board received the requested documentation. The Board's Individual License Evaluator ("Evaluator") subsequently reviewed the documents.
- 8. Applicant's personal statement and court records documented that Applicant's felony charges were reduced to misdemeanors, and she successfully completed a diversion agreement which included restitution, probation, and community service. Evaluator noted the severity of the original charges and that Applicant failed to disclose them on her application. However, due to the length of time elapsed since diversion completion, and the fact there have been no legal concerns since, Evaluator recommended approval of registration on a probationary status.

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

1. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.

- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3), the Board may place in a probationary status the license of any pharmacist who has been found guilty of unprofessional conduct.
- 3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1626(uuu), unprofessional conduct means conduct likely to deceive or harm the public.
- 4. Applicant's misdemeanors, as well as her failure to divulge such in her application, are unprofessional conduct and a basis to place Applicant's registration in a probationary status pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3).

### **ORDER**

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's Application for issuance of pharmacy technician registration is hereby GRANTED subject to a 2-year probationary status. The terms of Applicant's probation are as follows:

- Applicant must notify the Board of any change in employment within 10 days of the change and obtain Board approval for the change;
- Applicant must inform employers of the probationary status of her pharmacy technician registration;
- Applicant must obtain the signature of her pharmacist-in-charge (PIC) documenting knowledge of her probationary status to the Board; and
- Applicant must comply with all rules and regulations of the Pharmacy Practice
  Act.

### NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

1. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure

Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414,

Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final

order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file

a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial

review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive
