SUMMARY ORDER

NOW, on this 4th day of August, 2022, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Derek Douglas, (“Applicant”), for application for licensure by examination as a pharmacist in the state of Kansas.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board’s Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On DATE, Applicant was issued registration number 3-107170 by the Board to operate as a pharmacist intern in Kansas (“Applicant’s registration”).
2. On February 18, 2022, the Board entered into a Stipulation and Consent Order with Applicant, incorporated herein by reference, placing Applicant’s registration on probation for a minimum period of two years during which Applicant was to appear before the Board, comply with all requirements of the Kansas Pharmacy Act and all regulations thereunder, immediately enter into a Statement of Understanding with the Kansas Pharmacists Association (“KPhA”) which operates the Kansas Pharmacist Recovery Network (“KsPRN”) for a period of

not less than five (5) years, comply with certain notification requirements, and comply with the Stipulation and Consent Order. Under the KsPRN Agreement, Applicant was to do the following:

- a. fully cooperate with the recommendations and requirements of the persons managing and implementing the evaluation and treatment program recommended and requested by the KsPRN Agreement and any further requirements of the Board;
 - b. be in full compliance with the requirements of the KsPRN Agreement and other requirements placed on Applicant by the KsPRN, including, but not limited to, full and continued compliance with the requirement to cooperate with requests for random body fluid screens and any recommended therapy as provided in the KsPRN Agreement; and
 - c. authorize KsPRN and any provider of evaluation or treatment programs he engages in to provide full and complete documentation and information regarding Applicant's involvement the programs, Applicant's evaluations and treatment, including, but not limited to, records and medical reports.
3. On May 27, 2022, the Board received Applicant's application for licensure by examination a pharmacist in the State of Kansas ("Applicant's Application").

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3), the Board may place in a probationary status the license of any pharmacist who has been found guilty of unprofessional conduct.
2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1626(vv)(7), unprofessional conduct means conduct likely to deceive, defraud or harm the public.

3. Paragraphs 1 through 5 of the Board’s Stipulation and Consent Order are hereby incorporated by reference, and are a basis to place in a probationary status Applicant’s pharmacist license application pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3).

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant’s Application for issuance of a Kansas pharmacist license is hereby GRANTED subject to a two-year probationary status. The terms of Applicant’s probation are outlined in Paragraph 6 of the Board’s Stipulation and Consent Order, which became final and effective on February 18, 2022.

NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

1. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.


