### SUMMARY ORDER OF DENIAL

NOW on this <u>15</u> day of March, 2018, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Destinee Frazier, ("Applicant"), for her application for registration as a Kansas pharmacy technician.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order of Denial in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

For purposes of this order, the Board's Executive Secretary makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. On or about January 12, 2018, the Board received Applicant's application for registration as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Applicant's Application").
- 2. Applicant answered "No" to the following question on her application: Have you been charged with or convicted of (includes plea of guilty or no contest) a criminal offense or is there any criminal charge now pending against you (other than minor traffic violations) in

any state or federal court whether or not a sentence was imposed, suspended, or diverted? This includes misdemeanors.

- 3. Application materials indicate Applicant had been arrested for felony unlawful possession of tool to remove theft detection device, misdemeanor theft, and interference with a law enforcement officer on September 1, 2017.
- 4. On or about January 23, 2018, the Board sent Applicant a letter requesting she submit a completed S-150 Personal History Form explaining her previous criminal history.
- 5. On or about February 12, 2018, the Board received Applicant's completed S-150 Form explaining the September 1, 2017 offenses.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1), the Board may deny the granting of a license to an applicant who has attempted to obtain a license by false or fraudulent means, including misrepresentation of a material fact.
- 3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2), the Board may deny the granting of a license to an applicant who has been convicted of a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude or gross immorality or any felony and the applicant fails to show that the applicant has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust;
- 4. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3), the Board may deny the granting of a license to an applicant who has been found guilty of unprofessional conduct.

5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1626(sss), unprofessional conduct means conduct likely to deceive or harm the public.

6. Applicant's answer of "No" regarding her previous criminal history on her

Application is a misrepresentation of a material fact and a basis to deny Applicant's

Application pursuant to 65-1627(a)(1).

7. Applicant's arrests for felony unlawful possession of tool to remove theft

detection device, misdemeanor theft, and interference with a law enforcement officer, and her

failure to show she has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust are bases to

deny Applicant's Application pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2).

8. Applicant's arrests for felony unlawful possession of a tool to remove theft

detection device, misdemeanor theft, and interference with a law enforcement officer are

unprofessional conduct and bases to deny Applicant's Application pursuant to 65-1627(a)(3).

9. Applicant's recent disregard for the law poses a danger to the public in the

pharmacy setting, and is a basis to deny Applicant's Application.

**ORDER** 

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's

Application for issuance of pharmacy technician registration is hereby DENIED.

NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

10. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative

Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW

Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

11. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order denying Applicant's

Registration as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon

the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

12. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file

a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

13. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek

judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated
