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SUMMARY ORDER OF REVOCATION

NOW on this 14th day of September, 2015, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Investigation Member, the matter of Creszen Gray, Pharmacy Technician ("Respondent").

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, et seq., and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, et seq., the Board's Investigation Member enters this Summary Order of Revocation in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the investigation materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Investigative Member makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. The Board has issued Respondent Pharmacy Technician Registration Number 14-17040 authorizing her to perform the functions of a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Respondent's Registration").
- 2. During the relevant period of time, Respondent worked as a pharmacy technician in the Walgreen Store # 05770 located at 3150 Seneca Street, Wichita, Kansas (the "Walgreen Pharmacy").

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3. Respondent has admitted that during the period of time she was employed at the Walgreen Pharmacy as a pharmacy technician, she stole various controlled substances, including Norco, Percocet and Lorazepam, for which she did not have a valid prescription,

from the Walgreen Pharmacy and self-administered them. Finally, Respondent has admitted

that she is addicted to the drugs she stole.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663 the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a

registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy

technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of

a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.

5. That the Board may take action against the license of a pharmacist for

unprofessional conduct or professional incompetency as set forth in K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3).

6. That K.S.A. 65-1626 (ccc)(5) defines unprofessional conduct to include the

unlawful possession of drugs.

7. That the Board may take action against the license of a pharmacist, pursuant to

K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(13), for self-administering any controlled substance without a practitioner's

prescription order or mid-level practitioner's order. That additionally, the Board may take

action against the license of a pharmacist, pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(4), for being addicted

to such a degree as to render the pharmacist unfit to practice the profession of pharmacy.

8. The Respondent's conduct in stealing drugs from her employer and self-

administering the drugs is a basis to revoke Respondent's Registration.

<u>ORDER</u>

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Respondent's

Registration is hereby REVOKED.

NOTICES

The Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

9. The Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas State

Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy,

800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of

this order.

10. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order revoking the

Respondent's Registration, as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board,

effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

11. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file

a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

12. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek

judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated
