### SUMMARY ORDER

Justin Hutmacher (the "Respondent") is currently authorized to function as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas by reason of the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") having issued him Registration No. 14-09084.

It has come to the attention of the Board's Investigative Member that Respondent unlawfully diverted 1500 tablet of hydrocodone 10/325; 70 tablets of Cialis 20 mg; 30 tablets of Viagra 100 mg and 20 tablets of levitra 20 mg from CVS?Pharmacy #05257, Olathe, Kansas.

After considering the foregoing, the Board's Investigation Member, in accordance with the authority granted to her by the Board, enter the following Summary Order.

### FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Investigation Member makes the following findings of fact:

- The Board has previously issued Respondent Registration No. 14-09084 which entitled him to function as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Respondent's Registration").
- That on or around November 4, 2010 the Respondent admitted to diversion of 1500 tablet
  of hydrocodone 10/325; 70 tablets of Cialis 20 mg; 30 tablets of Viagra 100 mg and 20
  tablets of levitra 20 mg after the employer, CVS?Prarmacy #05257, noticed the loss.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Investigation member makes the following conclusions of law and fact:

- That the Respondent was originally issued a registration number 14-09084 pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663.
- 2. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663(e)(1)the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.
- 3. That the Board may take action against the license of a pharmacist for unprofessional conduct or professional incompetency as set forth in K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3).
- That K.S.A. 65-1626d(hh)(5) defines unprofessional conduct as unlawful possession of drugs and unlawful diversion of drugs.
- The acts committed by Respondent are a basis for discipline of Respondent's Registration pursuant to the Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625 et seq.

## ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Respondent's Registration is hereby revoked.

## **NOTICES**

The Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

The Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas State Administrative
 Procedures Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW
 Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

- If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order revoking the Respondent's
  Registration, as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board, effective
  upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.
- 3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.
- 4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:
