**SUMMARY ORDER**

NOW, on this 13th day of January, 2023, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Jarriell Jackson, (“Applicant”), for application for registration as a Kansas pharmacy technician.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board’s Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The Board previously issued Applicant registration number 14-19159 to operate as a pharmacy technician in Kansas.
2. On August 5, 2021, the Board issued a Summary Order of Revocation revoking Applicant’s registration for failure to respond to lawful requests for information, which became effective on August 23, 2021.
3. On October 3, 2022, the Board received Applicant’s application for registration as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas (“Applicant’s Application”). Specifically, Applicant filed an application for reinstatement after revocation.

4. Applicant answered “Yes” to the following question on Applicant’s Application: “Have there been a denial of initial or renewal application, revocation, suspension, voluntary surrender, or any other disciplinary action taken by the State of Kansas or any other jurisdiction against any professional or occupational license or registration held by you?” The application directs that if the applicant answers yes, the applicant must attach a Form S-150: Personal History (“Form S-150”).

5. In conjunction with Applicant’s Application, Applicant provided a Form S-150 indicating there was a domestic dispute which resulted in an arrest but no charge.

6. On October 21, 2022, the Board mailed Applicant a letter requesting certified copies of the court pleadings from the case.

7. On or about December 12, 2022, the Board received the requested documentation which confirmed no charges had been formalized from the incident.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.

2. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(12), the Board may take action against the license of a pharmacist if the licensee has had a license to practice pharmacy revoked, suspended or limited, has been censured or has had other disciplinary action taken, or voluntarily surrendered the license after formal proceedings have been commenced, or has had an application for license denied, by the proper licensing authority of another state, territory, District of

Columbia or other country, a certified copy of the record of the action of the other jurisdiction being conclusive evidence thereof.

3. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15), the Board may take action against the license of a pharmacist if the licensee has failed to furnish the board, its investigators or its representatives any information legally requested by the board.

4. Applicant's past revocation and failure to respond to the Board's requests is a basis to place Applicant's pharmacy technician registration on a probationary status.

#### ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's Application for issuance of pharmacy technician registration is hereby GRANTED subject to a ONE-YEAR probationary status. The terms of Applicant's probation are as follows:

- Applicant must continue compliance with the terms of their court diversion agreement;
- Applicant must notify the Board of any change in their diversion status within 10 days of the change;
- Applicant must notify the Board of any arrest or criminal charge within 10 days of the date of the arrest or charge;
- Applicant must respond to the Board's regular check-in requests;
- Applicant must notify the Board of any change in employment within 10 days of the change;
- Applicant must inform employers of the probationary status of their pharmacy technician registration;

- Applicant must obtain the signature of their pharmacist-in-charge (PIC) documenting knowledge of her probationary status to the Board; and
- Applicant must comply with all rules and regulations of the Pharmacy Practice Act.

NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:


1. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.
2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.
3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.
4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is
