SUMMARY ORDER OF DENIAL

NOW on this <u>30</u> day of May, 2018, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Adrienne Johnson, ("Applicant"), for application for a Kansas pharmacy technician registration.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order of Denial in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Executive Secretary makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. On January 2, 2018, the Board received Applicant's application for registration as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Applicant's Application").
- 2. As part of Applicant's Application she answered "Yes" to the question: "Have you ever had a felony or misdemeanor conviction expunged from your record?" The application form directs that if the applicant answers yes, the applicant must attach a Form S-150: Personal History.

- 3. Applicant attached a Form S-150 disclosing a 1998 robbery offense.
- 4. Additional application material indicated Applicant had the following additional offenses: a 1986 assault offense; a 1988 assault offense; a 1994 battery offense; a 1996 forgery offense; a 1996 unlawful use of weapon offense; a 1997 felony possession of a controlled substance offense; a 1997 failure to appear offense; a 2006 domestic assault offense; and a 2013 driving while suspended offense.
- 5. On January 12, 2018, the Board sent a letter to Applicant requesting submission of a Form S-150 to explain the Applicant's additional offenses.
- 6. On March 1, 2018, the Board sent a second letter to Applicant requesting submission of a Form S-150 to explain the Applicant's additional offenses.
- 7. On April 6, 2018, the Board sent a final letter to Applicant requesting submission of a Form S-150 to explain the Applicant's additional offenses.
- 8. To date, the Board has not received a completed S-150 Personal History form from Applicant or any correspondence.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 9. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.
- 10. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1), the licensee has obtained, renewed or reinstated, or attempted to obtain, renew or reinstate, a license by false or fraudulent means, including misrepresentation of a material fact.

11. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3), the Board may deny the granting of a license

to an Applicant who has been found guilty of unprofessional conduct.

12. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1626(sss), unprofessional conduct means conduct likely

to deceive or harm the public.

13. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15), the Board may deny the granting of a license

to a pharmacist if the licensee has failed to furnish the board, its investigators or its

representatives any information legally requested by the board.

14. Applicant's failure to disclose her entire previous criminal history is a

misrepresentation of a material fact and a basis to deny Applicant's Application pursuant to

K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1).

15. Applicant's various felony and misdemeanor offenses are unprofessional

conduct and a basis to deny Applicant's Application pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3).

16. Applicant's failure to provide the Board with legally requested information

concerning applicant's previous criminal history via the S-150 Personal History form is a basis

to deny Applicant's Application for failure to comply with K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15).

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's

Application is hereby DENIED.

NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

17. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative

Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW

Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this

order.

18. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order denying Applicant's

Registration as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon

the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

19. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file

a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

20. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek

judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated
