EMERGENCY AGENCY ORDER

Kyle B. Jones ("Respondent") is currently authorized to practice as a pharmacy intern in the State of Kansas by reason of the Kansas Board of Pharmacy ("Board") having issued him Pharmacy Intern Registration No. 3-06291.

It has come to the attention of the Board's Investigation Member that the Respondent, while acting as a pharmacist intern, has diverted drugs belonging to his employer.

After considering the foregoing, the Board's Investigation Member, in accordance with the authority granted to him by the Board, enters the following emergency agency order, pursuant to K.S.A. 77-536 and K.S.A. 65-1676 (d)(1) and (2).

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Investigation Member makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. The Board has previously issued Respondent Pharmacy Intern Registration number 3-06291, which entitled him to practice as a pharmacy intern in the State of Kansas ("Registration").
- 2. While acting as a pharmacist intern, Respondent diverted drugs belonging to his employer.

3. Respondent's continuation of pharmacy intern functions would constitute an imminent danger to the public health and safety.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Investigation Member makes the following conclusions of law and fact:

- 1. Respondent's continuation in the practice of a pharmacy intern would constitute an imminent danger to the public health and safety. The least restrictive way to prevent or avoid the imminent danger Respondent poses to the public health, safety and welfare is to suspend Respondent's Registration.
- 2. There is cause to believe the acts committed by Respondent could form the basis for discipline of Respondent's pharmacy intern registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1676 (d)(1) and (2) and K.S.A. 65-1627 (a)(3), (5) and (13).

III. EMERGENCY ORDER

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-536 and K.S.A. 65-1676(d)(1) and (2), and based upon the foregoing findings and conclusions, Respondent's Registration as a pharmacy intern is hereby suspended until further order of the Board, effective immediately.

Within fifteen (15) days after service of this Emergency Agency Order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of this Emergency Agency Order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:
