SUMMARY ORDER OF REVOCATION

NOW on this ______ day of February, 2018, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Kaleana Omehia, Pharmacy Technician ("Respondent").

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, et seq., and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, et seq., the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order of Revocation in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the investigation materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Investigative Member makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. The Board has issued Respondent Pharmacy Technician Registration Number 14-101624 authorizing her to perform the functions of a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Respondent's Registration").
- 2. On or about November 30, 2017 the Board received a KBI criminal history report indicating Respondent had been arrested and charged with misdemeanor theft on May 4, 2017 and convicted of misdemeanor theft on September 14, 2017.

- 3. On or about October 3, 2017, the Board sent Respondent a letter requesting she submit a completed S-150 Form explaining the offense.
- 4. On or about November 20, 2017, the Board sent respondent a second letter requesting she submit a completed S-150 Form.
- 5. On or about December 20, 2017, the Board sent respondent a final letter via email requesting she submit a completed S-150 Form.
- 6. Respondent has not responded to the Board's requests for a completed S-150 Form.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 7. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663 the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.
- 8. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2), the Board may take action against the license of a pharmacist who has been convicted of a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude or gross immorality or any felony and the licensee fails to show that the licensee has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust;
- 9. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3), the Board may take action against the license of a pharmacist who has been found guilty of unprofessional conduct.
- 10. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1626(sss), unprofessional conduct means conduct likely to deceive or harm the public.

- 11. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15), the Board may take action against the license of a pharmacist who has failed to furnish the board, its investigators or its representatives any information legally requested by the board;
- 12. Respondent's conviction for misdemeanor theft and failure to show she has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust is a basis to revoke her technician registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3).
- 13. Respondent's arrest and conviction for misdemeanor theft is unprofessional conduct and a basis to revoke her technician registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3).
- 14. Respondent's failure to respond to the Board's request for information regarding her criminal history and is a basis to revoke her technician registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15).

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Respondent's Registration is hereby REVOKED.

NOTICES

The Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

- 15. The Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.
- 16. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order revoking the Respondent's Registration, as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

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- 17. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.
- 18. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:
