# SUMMARY ORDER OF DENIAL

NOW on this <u>27</u> day of June, 2018, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Rochelle McKinney, ("Applicant"), for application for a Kansas pharmacy technician application.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order of Denial in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

## FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Executive Secretary makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. On February 19, 2018, the Board received Applicant's application for registration as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Applicant's Application").
- 2. As part of Applicant's Application she answered "No" to the question: "Have you been charged with or convicted of (includes plea of guilty or no contest) a criminal offense or is there any criminal charge now pending against you (other than minor traffic violations) in

any state or federal court whether or not a sentence was imposed, suspended, or diverted? This

includes misdemeanors."

3. Application materials indicated that Applicant had a 2009 felony controlled

substance conviction, a 2011 assault offense, and a 2017 resisting arrest offense on her record.

4. On March 9, 2018, the Board sent a letter to Applicant requesting submission of

a Form S-150: Personal History to explain the Applicant's criminal history or offenses.

5. On April 16, 2018, the Board sent a second letter to Applicant requesting

submission of a Form S-150: Personal History to explain the Applicant's criminal history or

offenses.

6. On May 29, 2018, the Board sent a final letter to Application requesting

submission of a Form S-150: Personal History to explain the Applicant's criminal history or

offenses.

7. To date, the Board has not received a completed S-150 Personal History form

from Applicant or any correspondence.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

8. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a

registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy

technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of

a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.

9. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1), the Board may deny the granting of a

license to a pharmacist if the licensee has attempted to obtain a license by false or fraudulent

means, including misrepresentation of a material fact.

- 10. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2), the Board may deny the granting of a license to a pharmacist if a licensee has been convicted of a felony and the licensee fails to show sufficient rehabilitation to warrant the public trust.
- 11. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15), the Board may deny the granting of a license to a pharmacist if the licensee has failed to furnish the board, its investigators or its representatives any information legally requested by the board.
- 12. Applicant's answer of "No" regarding her previous criminal history is a misrepresentation of a material fact and a basis to deny Applicant's Application pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1).
- 13. Applicant's prior felony controlled substance conviction and failure to show sufficient rehabilitation to warrant the public trust is a basis to deny Applicant's Application pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2).
- 14. Applicant's failure to provide the Board with legally requested information concerning applicant's criminal history via the S-150 Personal History form is a basis to deny Applicant's Application for failure to comply with K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15).

#### ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's Application is hereby DENIED.

# **NOTICES**

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

15. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW

Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

16. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order denying Applicant's Registration as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

17. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

18. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:
