SUMMARY ORDER

NOW on this ____ day of February, 2019, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Javier Mendoza, ("Applicant"), for his application for registration as a Kansas pharmacy technician.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Executive Secretary makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. On or about December 26, 2018, the Board received Applicant's application for registration as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Applicant's Application").
- 2. Applicant answered "Yes" to the following question on his application: Have you been charged with or convicted of (includes plea of guilty or no contest) a criminal offense or is there any criminal charge now pending against you (other than minor traffic violations) in

any state or federal court whether or not a sentence was imposed, suspended, or diverted? This includes misdemeanors.

- 3. Applicant attached a Personal History Form S-150 with his application, disclosing a May 12, 2018 arrest for driving under the influence of alcohol, minor in consumption of alcohol, and texting while driving. Applicant indicated he had received a diversion for these charges.
- 4. On January 3, 2019, the Board requested a copy of Applicant's signed diversion agreement.
- 5. On January 18, 2019 the Board received Applicant's signed diversion agreement for the charges.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3), the Board may limit the license of an Applicant who has been found guilty of unprofessional conduct.
- 3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1626(ttt), unprofessional conduct means conduct likely to deceive or harm the public.
- 4. Applicant's recent arrest for driving while intoxicated is unprofessional conduct and a basis to limit Applicant's Registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3).

<u>ORDER</u>

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's Application for issuance of pharmacy technician registration is hereby GRANTED subject to a 2-year probationary status. The terms of Applicant's probation are as follows:

- Applicant must notify the Board of completion of his diversion within 30 days of completion;
- Applicant must notify the Board of any change in employment within 10 days of the change;
- Applicant must inform employers of the probationary status of his pharmacy technician registration;
- Applicant must obtain the signature of his pharmacist-in-charge (PIC) documenting knowledge of his probationary status to the Board;
- Applicant must comply with all rules and regulations of the Pharmacy

 Practice Act.

NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

- 5. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.
- 6. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order denying Applicant's Registration as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

- Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file 7. a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.
- Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek 8. judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is
