SUMMARY ORDER OF DENIAL

NOW on this <u>12</u> day of June, 2018, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Mary Murry, ("Applicant"), for renewal application for a Kansas pharmacy technician registration.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order of Denial in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Executive Secretary makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. On or about October 23, 2017, the Board received Applicant's renewal application for her pharmacy technician registration in the State of Kansas ("Applicant's Application").
- 2. As part of Applicant's Application she answered "Yes" to the question: "Have you been convicted of (includes plea of guilty or no contest) a criminal offense or is there any criminal charge now pending against you (other than minor traffic violations) in any state or

federal court whether or not a sentence was imposed, suspended, or diverted? This includes

misdemeanors." The application form directs that if the applicant answers yes, the applicant

must attach a Form S-150: Personal History.

3. On October 23, 2017, the Board sent an email to Applicant requesting

submission of a Form S-150: Personal History to explain the Applicant's criminal history or

offenses.

4. On February 14, 2018, the Board sent a second email to Applicant requesting

submission of a Form S-150: Personal History to explain the Applicant's criminal history or

offenses.

5. On April 9, 2018, the Board sent a final letter to Applicant requesting

submission of a Form S-150: Personal History to explain the Applicant's criminal history or

offenses. A deadline of May 15, 2018 for submission of the S-150 was given.

6. To date, the Board has not received a completed S-150 Personal History form

from Applicant or any correspondence.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

7. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a

registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy

technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of

a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.

8. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2), the Board may deny the granting of a

license to a pharmacist if the licensee has been convicted of a misdemeanor involving moral

turpitude or any felony and the licensee fails to show that the licensee has been sufficiently

rehabilitated to warrant the public trust.

9. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15), the Board may deny the granting of a

license to a pharmacist if the licensee has failed to furnish the board, its investigators or its

representatives any information legally requested by the board.

10. Applicant's admission to being convicted of a criminal offense and failure to

show she has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust is a basis to deny

Applicant's Application for failure to comply with K.S.A. 65-1627(2).

11. Applicant's failure to provide the Board with legally requested information

concerning Applicant's previous criminal history via the S-150 Personal History form is a basis

to deny Applicant's Application for failure to comply with K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15).

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's

Application is hereby DENIED.

NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

12. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative

Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW

Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this

order.

13. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order denying Applicant's

Registration as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon

the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

14. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file

a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

15. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:
