### AMENDED SUMMARY ORDER

**NOW** on February 21, 2020, comes before the Kansas State Board of Pharmacy through its Executive Secretary (hereinafter referred to as the "Board") the matter of the license renewal application of Tamara Nyachira (hereinafter referred to as "Respondent") to engage in the practice of pharmacy in the state of Kansas.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, et seq., and in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, et seq., the Board enters this Amended Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the renewal materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions, and order:

### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

- 1. The Board has issued Respondent Pharmacy License Number 1-14019 authorizing Respondent to perform the functions of a pharmacist in the State of Kansas.
- 2. On or around June 29, 2019, Respondent submitted a renewal application to engage in the practice of pharmacy in the State of Kansas.
- 3. In the renewal application, Respondent requested to renew the license on active status.
- 4. At the end of the renewal application, Respondent agreed to the following statement prior to submitting the completed renewal application: "I hereby attest that I have completed all

continuing education hours required by law to renew my license."

- 5. Respondent's renewal application was selected for an audit to provide proof of Respondent's continuing education certificates or a transcript of completion of required hours. On two separate occasions, the Board sent a letter to Respondent's address of record requesting such proof.
- 6. Respondent's CPE Monitor accessed by the Board reflected 24 hours of continuing education to renew Respondent's pharmacy license. However, Respondent failed to respond to the Board's request to provide proof of Respondent's continuing education hours.
- 7. On December 4, 2019, the Board sent an email to Respondent's email address of record requesting proof of Respondent's continuing education hours.
- 8. On December 23, 2019, Respondent emailed the Board with additional information and indicating she did not have any additional hours of continuing education.
- 9. Respondent provided proof of 25 hours of continuing education to renew Respondent's pharmacy license.
- 10. Respondent was not eligible for obtaining prorated hours since Respondent was continuously licensed to practice for the entire biennial licensure period.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 11. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(9), the Board may deny, revoke, suspend, or place on probation any pharmacist license upon a finding that Respondent failed to comply with the continuing education requirements of the Board for license renewal.
- 12. Pursuant to K.A.R. 68-1-1b, 30 hours of continuing education shall be required for renewal of a pharmacist license during each licensure period, which must be obtained in the two-year licensure period ending on the June 30 expiration date of each license.
  - 13. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1), the Board may deny, revoke, suspend, or place on

probation any pharmacist license upon a finding that Respondent renewed or attempted to renew a license by false means, including misrepresentation.

- 14. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, in addition to any other penalty imposed by the Pharmacy Practice Act, the Board may assess a civil fine for a violation of K.S.A. 65-1627(a), in an amount not to exceed \$5,000 for each violation.
- 15. Respondent was required to provide proof of completion of 30 hours of continuing education earned between July 1, 2017 and June 30, 2019.
- 16. By only providing proof of completion of 25 hours of continuing education, Respondent failed to complete the required 30 hours of continuing education for renewal of Respondent's license, in violation of K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(9).
- 17. Respondent falsely attested on the renewal application that Respondent had completed all continuing education hours required by law to renew Respondent's license, in violation of K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1). Though material, the Board makes <u>no finding</u> about whether Respondent's misrepresentation was intentional.
- 18. The role of the Board is to protect the citizens of Kansas. The Board regards the failure to comply with the continuing education requirements for licensure as a serious issue. Given the number of home-study, web-based, and live programs available, achieving the 30 hours required each biennial renewal period cannot be viewed as a burden. Without continued investment in pharmacy education, the vision of quality pharmacy providers in Kansas will not be met. In order to provide safe, effective, and high quality healthcare for Kansas patients, the practice of pharmacy requires lifelong improvement and education.

### **ORDER**

Based on the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, the Board orders the following:

For Respondent's violation of K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1) and (9), a fine is assessed in the amount

of \$100 for each hour of missing or falsified continuing education, with a minimum of \$500. Respondent is ordered to pay the \$500 fine by check or money order within 30 days of the date of this Order.

Furthermore, an additional four hours of continuing education will be required for each hour of missing or falsified continuing education. Respondent shall complete 20 hours of additional continuing education and provide proof of completion to the Board within 30 days of the date of this Order. Completion of these hours shall not count toward Respondent's next continuing education renewal requirement.

#### **NOTICES**

Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

- 1. The Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.
- 2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.
- 3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.
- 4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:
