JOURNAL ENTRY

NOW this 8th day of September, 2011, the above captioned matter comes before the Kansas State Board of Pharmacy ("Board") on the Petitioner's Motion to Terminate probation. The respondent does not appear. The Board appears by and through Holly L. Fisher, Compliance Counsel to the Board. The Board, after reviewing the file, hearing the statements of counsel, and being generally apprised of the premises finds as follows:

- 1. Notice has been sent to the respondent and the Board has jurisdiction to hear this matter.
- 2. Petitioner's license to practice pharmacy was granted with certain restrictions and conditions on July 9, 2009 through a Final Agency Order, which included:
 - (a) "Poulos shall not work as a pharmacist for more than forty (40) hours in any one week (Monday through Sunday) period;
 - (b) Poulos shall not work as a pharmacist for any period of time without another pharmacist or pharmacy technician present in the pharmacy;
 - (c) Poulos shall not serve as a preceptor or pharmacist in charge;
 - (d) If Poulos is not currently a party to an agreement with the Kansas Pharmacy Impaired Provider Program, Poulos shall immediately enter into an agreement with the Kansas Pharmacy Impaired Provider Program for treatment. The agreement must be for a period of no less than five (5) years;

- (e) Poulos shall fully cooperate with the recommendations and requirements of the persons managing and implementing the Kansas Pharmacy Impaired Provider Program, the recommendations and requirements of the persons managing and implementing the evaluation and treatment programs recommended or required by the Kansas Pharmacy Impaired Provider Program and the further requirements of the Board.
- (f) Poulos shall authorize the Kansas Pharmacy Impaired Provider Program and any provider of evaluation or treatment programs he engages in to provide full and complete documentation and information regarding his involvement in the programs, his evaluations and treatment, including but not limited to, all records and medical reports;
- (g) Poulos shall take and pass the MPJE prior to practicing pharmacy in the State of Kansas;
- (h) Poulos shall provide a copy of this Final Agency Order to all prospective employers at the time of first interview;
- Poulos shall provide a copy of this Final Agency Order to each pharmacist in charge of any pharmacy in which he works;
- (j) Poulos shall notify the Board's Excutive Secretary in writing within ten (10) days of beginning any new employment as a pharmacist.
- 3. Petitioner has requested early release by the Board from the Final Agency Order of the Board dated July 9, 2009, which places Petitioner's license to practice pharmacy in the State of Kansas on probation until October 7, 2013.
 - 4. The Board finds the July 9, 2009 Final Agency Order to continue to be in effect.
- The Board, after discussion and due diligence DENIES the Motion of Petitioner to be released from probation.

6. Petitioner shall remain on probation until he successfully completes the term of that probation on October 7, 2013.

ORDER

WHEREUPON, Petitioner's MOTION is DENIED. Petitioner's license to practice pharmacy in the State of Kansas shall remain on PROBATION until October 7, 2013. Upon successful completion of probation, the respondent is encouraged to move the Board again to have his probation lifted.

NOTICES

Petitioner is hereby notified as follows:

- Petitioner may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas State Administrative Procedures
 Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka,
 KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.
- 2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order denying Petitioner's motion to lift probation shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.
- 3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.
- 4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:
