## **SUMMARY ORDER OF REVOCATION**

NOW on this <u>1</u> day of January, 2019, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Casey Reece, Pharmacy Technician ("Respondent").

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order of Revocation in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the investigation materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

## FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Executive Secretary makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. The Board has issued Respondent Pharmacy Technician Registration Number 14-12037 authorizing her to perform the functions of a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Respondent's Registration").
- 2. On or about July 19, 2018, it came to the Board's attention that Respondent's Missouri Pharmacy Technician Registration was listed as "revoked" in the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) database.

- 3. On or about July 25, 2018, the Board requested documentation from the Missouri Board of Pharmacy related to Respondent's Missouri revocation. The Missouri Board of Pharmacy provided official documentation dated March 29, 2018, stating that Respondent was placed on the Missouri Pharmacy Technician Employment Disqualification list and may not act or be employed as a pharmacy technician in the state of Missouri for a period of five years. The documentation stated that the Missouri Board of Pharmacy's investigation revealed that Respondent removed the personal belongings of a coworker without permission.
- 4. On July 27, 2018, the Board mailed a letter to Respondent requesting she submit a Personal History Form S-150 to explain the Missouri revocation.
- 5. On September 7, 2018, the Board mailed a second letter to Respondent requesting she submit a Personal History Form S-150 to explain the Missouri revocation.
- 6. On October 18, 2018, the Board mailed a final letter to Respondent requesting she submit a Personal History Form S-150 to explain the Missouri revocation.
  - 7. To date, the Board has not received any correspondence from Respondent.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 8. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663 the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.
- 9. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(12), the Board may take action against the license of a pharmacist if the pharmacist has had a license to practice pharmacy revoked, suspended or limited, has been censured or has had other disciplinary action taken, or voluntarily surrendered the license after formal proceedings have been commenced, or has had

an application for license denied, by the proper licensing authority of another state, territory, District of Columbia or other country, a certified copy of the record of the action of the other jurisdiction being conclusive evidence thereof.

- 10. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627 (a)(15), the Board may take action against the license of a pharmacist if the pharmacist has failed to furnish the board, its investigators or its representatives any information legally requested by the board.
- 11. The revocation of Respondent's Missouri Pharmacy Technician Registration, as evidenced by the official documentation dated March 29, 2018, is a basis to revoke Respondent's registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(12).
- 12. Respondent's failure to provide the Board with the requested documentation is a basis to revoke Respondent's Registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15).
- 13. Respondent's failure to supply the Board with the requested documentation regarding her updated criminal history is a basis to revoke Respondent's Registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15).

### **ORDER**

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Respondent's Registration is hereby REVOKED.

#### NOTICES

The Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

14. The Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

15. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order revoking the Respondent's Registration, as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

16. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

17. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:
