## SUMMARY ORDER

NOW on this 13 day of February, 2019, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Joshua Rodgers, ("Applicant"), for his application for registration as a Kansas pharmacy technician.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, et seq., and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, et seq., the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

## **FINDINGS OF FACT**

For purposes of this order, the Board's Executive Secretary makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. On or about July 27, 2018, the Board received Applicant's application for registration as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Applicant's Application").
- 2. Applicant answered "Yes" to the following question on his application: Have you been charged with or convicted of (includes plea of guilty or no contest) a criminal offense or is there any criminal charge now pending against you (other than minor traffic violations) in

any state or federal court whether or not a sentence was imposed, suspended, or diverted? This includes misdemeanors.

- 3. The Board received information regarding a 2007 disorderly conduct offense that was dismissed
- 4. On August 23, 2018, the Board mailed Applicant a letter requesting he provide a completed Personal History Form S-150, as well as certified copies of the court pleadings from each case.
- 5. On or about August 27, 2018, the Board received the requested documentation.

  Applicant's personal statement and court documents included
- 6. Applicant's personal statement showed moral fitness and maturity, elaborating significantly on his previous misconduct and showing personal responsibility for his previous wrongdoing.

. Additionally, Applicant included several letters of recommendation and character references along with his personal statement.

7. On or about January 16, 2018, the Board's Individual License Evaluator conducted a phone interview with Applicant.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2), the Board may place in a probationary status the license of any pharmacist upon a finding that the licensee has been convicted of any felony and the licensee fails to show that the licensee has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust.
- 3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3), the Board may place in a probationary status the license of any pharmacist who has been found guilty of unprofessional conduct.
- 4. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1626(ttt), unprofessional conduct means conduct likely to deceive or harm the public.
- 5. Applicant's is a basis to place Applicant's registration in a probationary status pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2), as he is still on probation and therefore, unable to show that he has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust at this time.
- 6. Applicant's as well as his as well as his are unprofessional conduct and a basis to place Applicant's registration in a probationary status pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3).

#### ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's Application for issuance of pharmacy technician registration is hereby GRANTED subject to a 2-year probationary status. The terms of Applicant's probation are as follows:

- Applicant must continue compliance with the terms of his
- Applicant must notify the Board of any change in his status within 10 days of the change;
- Applicant must notify the Board of any change in employment within 10 days of the change and obtain Board approval for the change;
- Applicant must inform employers of the probationary status of his pharmacy technician registration;
- Applicant must obtain the signature of his pharmacist-in-charge (PIC) documenting knowledge of his probationary status to the Board; and
- Applicant must comply with all rules and regulations of the Pharmacy
   Practice Act.

#### NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

7. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

8. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order denying Applicant's Registration as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon

the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

9. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file

a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

10. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek

judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated
