SUMMARY ORDER OF DENIAL

NOW on this <u>/o</u> day of April, 2019, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Michael Schieffer, ("Applicant"), for application for a Kansas pharmacy technician application.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, et seq., and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, et seq., the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order of Denial in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Executive Secretary makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. On or about October 22, 2018, the Board received Applicant's application for registration as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Applicant's Application").
- 2. As part of Applicant's Application he answered "Yes" to the question: "Have you ever been convicted of (includes plea of guilty or no contest) a criminal offense or is there any criminal charge now pending against you (other than minor traffic violations) in any state

or federal court whether or not a sentence was imposed, suspended, or diverted? This includes

misdemeanors." Applicant disclosed that he had a previous DUI offense on his criminal record.

3. Additional application materials indicated Applicant had also been convicted of

battery in 2008.

4. On November 2, 2018, the Board mailed Applicant a letter requesting he

provide a completed Personal History Form S-150 with a more detailed explanation for the

DUI and an explanation for the battery offense, as well as certified court documents for each

case.

5. On December 18, 2018, the Board mailed Applicant a second letter requesting

he provide a completed Personal History Form S-150 with a more detailed explanation for the

DUI and an explanation for the battery offense, as well as certified court documents for each

case.

6. On January 29, 2019, the Board mailed Applicant a final letter requesting he

provide a completed Personal History Form S-150 with a more detailed explanation for the

DUI and an explanation for the battery offense, as well as certified court documents for each

case.

7. To date, the Board has not received the requested documentation from Applicant

or any correspondence.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

8. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a

registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy

technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of

a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.

9. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15), the Board may deny the granting of a

license to a pharmacist if the licensee has failed to furnish the board, its investigators or its

representatives any information legally requested by the board.

10. Applicant's failure to provide the Board with the legally requested information

concerning Applicant's previous offenses is a basis to deny Applicant's Application pursuant to

K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15).

<u>ORDER</u>

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's

Application is hereby DENIED.

NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

11. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative

Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW

Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this

order.

12. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final

order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

13. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file

a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

14. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek

judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated
