NOTICE OF PROPOSED DEFAULT ORDER AND PROPOSED DEFAULT ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes on for consideration by the Kansas State Board of Pharmacy (Board) to enter a Proposed Default Order.

The Board finds:

- 1. On March 17, 2016, the Board issued a Summary Order of Denial with regard to the application of Jeffrey James Scott for registration as a Kansas pharmacy technician.
- On March 28, 2016, Mr. Scott requested an Administrative Hearing. The board sent an Acknowledgement of Hearing Request on March 31, 2016.
- 3. On July 18th, 2016, a Notice of Administrative Hearing was served on Mr. Scott, setting the hearing in this matter for November 3, 2016 at 9:45 a.m.
- 4. The notice specifically provided that "[a]ny party who fails to attend or participate in the hearing or in any other portion of the adjudicative process may be held in default pursuant to K.S.A. 77-520 and the Board may conduct further proceedings necessary for adjudication without the participation of the Respondent."
- 5. The hearing in this matter was convened on November 3, 2016 at 9:45 a.m. Mr. Scott did not appear.
- 6. Mr. Scott is in default pursuant to K.S.A. 77-520.
- 7. This Proposed Default Order shall become effective seven days after service or ten days after mailing of this order unless Mr. Scott files a written motion with the Board at the address provided stating why the Proposed Default Order should be vacated and the order is then vacated.

- If this Proposed Default Order becomes effective, Mr. Scott's application for 8. registration as a Kansas pharmacy technician shall be denied.
- If the Proposed Default Order becomes effective, Mr. Scott may petition for 9. review by the Board within fifteen days thereafter. Failure to timely petition for review by the Board may preclude judicial review.
- If this Proposed Default Order becomes effective and neither party requests 10. further administrative review, it shall become a Final Order.
- If this Proposed Default Order becomes a Final Order, any petition for judicial 11. review must be filed within the deadline established in K.S.A. 77-613. Any petition for judicial review must be mailed or personally delivered to: Alexandra Blasi, Executive Secretary, Kansas State Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, Kansas 66612.

The Board, being well and duly advised in the premises, now enters this Proposed Default Order against Mr. Scott. It shall take effect as specified in the above findings.

SUMMARY ORDER OF DENIAL

NOW on this ______ day of March, 2016, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Investigation Member, the application of Jeffrey James Scott (the "Applicant") for registration as a Kansas pharmacy technician.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, et seq., and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, et seq., the Board's Investigation Member enters this Summary Order of Denial in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Investigative Member makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. On or about January 6, 2016, the Board received Applicant's application for registration as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Applicant's Application").
- 2. As part of Applicant's Application he answered "Yes" to the question: "Have you ever been cited, charged with, or convicted of the commission of any crime; offense; or violation of the law in any state or by the federal government, even if those charges were dismissed, suspended, diverted, or expunged?" The application form directs that if the applicant

answers yes, the applicant "must provide a notarized written detailed explanation of the

circumstances."

3. The notarized statement Applicant provided with Applicant's Application reads

as follows: "I was convicted of possession of child pornography in Wichita, KS in 2001 and

sentenced to probation."

4. Applicant did not submit to the Board any additional statements, documents, or

other evidence explaining his felony offense or attempting to demonstrate rehabilitation.

5. The background report provided to the Board by the Kansas Bureau of

Investigation reports that on or about July 30, 2001, Applicant entered a plea of guilty to two

counts of Possession/distribution of child pornography. Applicant was sentenced to probation

for a period of three years and home detention for a period of six months. However,

Applicant's background report lists a status of "Status-Probation."

6. The Kansas Public Offender Registry lists Applicant as a sexual offender and his

registration is scheduled to end on July 30, 2016.

7. As part of Applicant's Application, he certified that the information provided

was true, correct and complete and that he understood that withholding relevant information

was grounds for denying his application.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

8. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a

registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy

technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of

a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.

9. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2), the Board may deny the renewal of a

license to a pharmacist if a licensee has been convicted of a felony and the licensee fails to

show sufficient rehabilitation to warrant the public trust.

10. Applicant's conviction for the felony of possessing child pornography and his

lack of evidence of rehabilitation is a basis to deny Applicant's Application for failure to

comply with K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2).

<u>ORDER</u>

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's

Application is hereby DENIED.

NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

11. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative

Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW

Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this

order.

12. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order denying Applicant's

Registration as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon

the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

13. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file

a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

14. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek

judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated
