STIPULATION AND CONSENT ORDER			
IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the Kansas Pharmacy			
Board (the "Board") and Brinson Steinhauser, RPT ("Respondent") as follows:			
1. The Board is represented herein by its attorney, Randall J. Forbes of Frieden &			
Forbes, 1414 SW Ashworth Place, Suite 201	, Topeka, I	Kansas 66604.	The Respondent is

2. The Board is the Kansas agency	vested with	the authority to	carry out and enforce
the provisions of the Kansas Pharmacy Law, K.S.A. 65-1626 et seq., (the "Act") including			
conducting hearings and proceedings to revoke, suspend or otherwise discipline a Kansas license			
to practice pharmacy.			
3. The Respondent is presently er	ntitled to en	ngage in the pra	actice of a pharmacy
technician in the State of Kansas by reason of the Board having issued him Kansas registration			
number 1417278 ("Kansas Registration"). At all times relevant hereto, the Respondent has held			

a registration to engage in the practice of a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas. On

November 20, 2020 Respondent applied to renew his registration as a Pharmacy Technician

("Renewal Application").

and determined that there are reasonable grounds to believe that Respondent has committed one or more acts in violation of K.S.A. 65-1627(a) which would justify the revocation or imposition of other disciplinary action against his Kansas Registration under the provisions of K.S.A. 65-

The Board's Investigation Member has received certain information, investigated,

1663(f)(1) and the assessment of an appropriate fine against Respondent under the provisions of

KS.A. 65-1658.

- 5. Respondent hereby admits and waives any further proof in this or any other proceeding before or initiated by the Board, and upon motion duly made, seconded, and passed, the Board finds:
- A. On August 31, 2019 Respondent was ticketed and charged with driving under the influence ("Charge"). On March 16, 202 Respondent plead no contest to the Charge and was convicted ("Conviction").
- B. Respondent first notified the Board of the Charge and Conviction on November 20, 2020. Respondent failed to notify the Board of the Charge and Conviction within 30 days as required by the Board's regulation K.A.R. 68-7-25(a).
- 6. Upon motion duly made, seconded, and passed, the Board finds and concludes that Respondent's failure to notify the Board of the Charge and Conviction in compliance with K.A.R. 68-7-25(a) warrants the imposition of appropriate disciplinary action against Respondent's Kansas Registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663(f)(1) and K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(8).
- 7. The Respondent agrees and consents and the Board finds concludes and orders that the following disposition is just and appropriate under the circumstances:
- A. ADMINISTRATIVE FINE. The Respondent agrees and the Board hereby orders that within 10 days of the effective date of the effective date of the Consent Order

contemplated hereby the Respondent shall pay to the Board an administrative fine in the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

- B. PROBATION. The Respondent agrees and the Board orders that the Respondent's Kansas License is hereby placed on a status of probation for a period of two (2) years from the effective date of the Consent Order contemplated hereby.
- C. CONDITIONAL REGISTRATION. Respondent agrees that upon his execution of this Stipulation, Respondent's Renewal Application will be conditionally approved, and he will be issued a conditional Kansas Pharmacy Technician Registration which will become permanent if, and only if, the Board approves this Stipulation and adopts the Consent Order anticipated hereby.
- D. OTHER REQUIREMENTS. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that as a condition of this Stipulation and Consent Order he must, and the Board further orders the Respondent to:
 - 1. Comply fully with this Stipulation and Consent Order; and
 - 2. Comply fully with the Kansas Pharmacy Act, the Board's rules and regulations and all state and federal laws relating to Kansas pharmacy technicians.
- 8. Respondent agrees that all information in the possession of the Board's Investigation Member, its staff, its investigators and or its attorney regarding the investigation which lead to this disciplinary action and all information discovered during the pendency of the disciplinary action may be disclosed to and considered by the Board as part of the presentation and consideration of the proposal of settlement in the form of this Stipulation and Consent Order, with or without the presence of the Respondent or his attorney. In the event that this Stipulation and Consent Order is not accepted and approved by the Board, the Respondent further waives

any objection to the Board members' consideration of this Stipulation and Consent Order or the information mentioned in the preceding sentence and further agrees to waive any claim of due process violation or the right to seek the disqualification of any Board member as a result of the Board member's consideration of said document and information.

- 9. The stipulations contained herein shall not become binding until this Stipulation and Consent Order is approved and entered as a final order by the Board. The Respondent acknowledges that the approval of the Board's Investigation Member or its attorney shall not constitute the approval of the Board or bind the Board to approve this Stipulation and Consent Order.
- 10. The Respondent agrees that this Stipulation and Consent Order is in conformance with Kansas and federal law and the Board has jurisdiction to enter into it as a final order of the Board. The Respondent further agrees, for purposes of this matter, that the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1626 et seq. is constitutional on its face and as applied in this case.
- 11. This Stipulation constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and may only be modified by a subsequent writing signed by them. The agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Kansas.
 - 12. The Respondent acknowledges that he has the following rights:
 - (a) To have formal notice of charges served upon him;
 - (b) To file a response to the charges;
- (c) To have notice of and participate in a formal adjudicative hearing with the Board or its designee making specific findings of facts and conclusions of law based only upon evidence admitted at such hearing; and

(d) To take advantage of all applicable provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501 et seq. and the Kansas Judicial Review Act, K.S.A.

77-601 et seq.

The Respondent freely waives these rights and acknowledges that said waiver is made

voluntarily and in consideration of the Board's limiting the disciplinary action taken against him

to those provided for herein. The Respondent further waives the right to seek reconsideration or

appeal or otherwise contest this Stipulation and Consent Order and the Consent Order provided

for herein.

13. The Respondent acknowledges that he enters into this Stipulation and Consent

Order freely and voluntarily after consultation with or an opportunity to consult with counsel of

his choosing. The Respondent further acknowledges that he has read this Stipulation and Consent

Order in its entirety, that he understands its legal consequences and that he agrees that none of

its terms are unconscionable, arbitrary, or capricious.

14. Time is of the essence to this Stipulation and Consent Order. Respondent

acknowledges and agrees that any violation of this Stipulation and Consent Order shall constitute

a willful violation of a lawful Board order and grounds for further disciplinary action against

him. The pendency of any disciplinary action arising out of an alleged violation of this

Stipulation and Consent Order shall not affect the obligation of Respondent to comply with all

terms and conditions of this Stipulation and Consent Order.

15. This Stipulation and Consent Order constitutes the entire and final agreement of

the parties. In the event any provision of this Stipulation and Consent Order is deemed invalid

or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall be severed and the remaining

provisions of this Stipulation and Consent Order shall be given full force and effect.

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- 16. Upon approval and entry of the Final Order by the Board, this Stipulation and Consent Order shall be a public record in the custody of the Board.
- 17. This Stipulation and Consent Order shall become effective on the day it is approved, accepted, and made an order of the Board by way of signature of the Board's authorized representative.
- 18. The Respondent acknowledges that he has been advised by the Board that he would have the right within 15 days after service of the Final Order provided for herein to file a petition for reconsideration with the Board and the right within 30 days after service of the Final Order provided for herein to file a petition for judicial review in a District Court of Kansas in accordance with the Kansas Judicial Review Act, K.S.A. 77-601 et seq. and to serve such a petition for judicial review on the Kansas Board of Pharmacy by serving Alexandra Blasi, JD, MBA, its Executive Secretary at 800 SW Jackson St., Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612. The Respondent hereby waives those rights.
