EMERGENCY AGENCY ORDER

Morgan G. Tichy, PharmD (the “Respondent”) is currently authorized to practice pharmacy in the State of Kansas by reason of the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”) having issued her License No. 1-16729.

It has come to the attention of the Board’s Investigation Member that during Respondent’s employment as PIC at Auburn Pharmacy #2-100544, 20375 W. 151st St., Suite 100A, Olathe, Kansas 66061, Respondent was suspected of diverting Adderall caps and on February 20, 2023, Respondent admitted to diverting and dependency with amphetamines. On February 20, 2023, Auburn Pharmacy terminated Respondent’s employment.

After considering the foregoing, the Board’s Executive Secretary, in accordance with the authority granted to her by the Board pursuant to the Board’s delegation of authority policy which was adopted November 27, 2018 and re-approved October 13, 2021, enters the following emergency agency order, pursuant to K.S.A. 77-536 and K.S.A. 65-1627(c).

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board’s Executive Secretary makes the following findings of fact:

1. The Board has previously issued Respondent license number 1-16729, which entitled her to practice pharmacy in the State of Kansas (“Respondent’s License”).

2. On February 10, 2023, Ryan Moore, PharmD, Vice President/Operations of Auburn Pharmacy in Olathe, Kansas, reported suspected loss of generic Adderall 25 mg caps by an employee and an investigation was commenced.
3. On February 20, 2023, Respondent advised the Board of her former employment as PIC at Auburn Pharmacy in Olathe, Kansas and her diversion and dependency on amphetamines.
4. Respondent's admitted diversion and dependency on amphetamines in her position as a Pharmacist poses a serious health risk to the public health and safety or welfare of individuals who she serves in her employment as a licensed Pharmacist.

II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND FACT

For purposes of this order, the Board's Executive Secretary makes the following conclusions of law and fact:

1. Respondent's continuation in the practice of pharmacy would constitute an immediate danger to the public health and safety or welfare. The least restrictive way to prevent or avoid the immediate danger Respondent poses to the public health, safety and welfare is to suspend Respondent's License.

2. There is cause to believe the acts committed by Respondent could form the basis for discipline of Respondent's License pursuant to various provisions of the Pharmacy Act, including K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3), as defined by K.S.A. 65-1626(III)(3), and K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(4), (5), (7), (8) and (13).

III. EMERGENCY ORDER

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-536 and K.S.A. 65-1627(c), and based upon the foregoing findings and conclusions, Respondent’s License is hereby suspended until further order of the Board, effective immediately.

Within fifteen (15) days after service of this Emergency Agency Order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.




