STIPULATION AND CONSENT ORDER

IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the Kansas Pharmacy Board (the "Board") and Walgreens Pharmacy #04186 located at 15100 W. 87th Street Parkway, Lenexa, Kansas ("Respondent") as follows:

1. The Board is represented herein by its attorney, Randall J. Forbes of Frieden,
Unrein & Forbes, LLP, 1414 SW Ashworth Place, Suite 201, Topeka, Kansas 66604. The
Respondent is represented herein by its attorney,
Dwayne A. Pinon, Director & Managing Counsel - Walgreen Co.

- 2. The Board is the Kansas agency vested with the authority to carry out and enforce the provisions of the Kansas Pharmacy Law, K.S.A. 65-1626 *et seq.*, (the "Act") including conducting hearings and proceedings to revoke, suspend or otherwise discipline a Kansas registration to operate a pharmacy.
- 3. The Respondent is presently entitled to operate a pharmacy in the State of Kansas by reason of the Board having issued it Kansas registration number 2-13087 ("Kansas Registration"). At all times relevant hereto, the Respondent has held a current registration to operate a pharmacy at 15100 West 87th Street Parkway, Lenexa, Kansas.
- 4. The Board's Investigation Member has received certain information, investigated and determined that there are reasonable grounds to believe that Respondent has operated in a manner that violates the Act.

Respondent hereby waives any further proof in this or any other proceeding before

or initiated by the Board with respect to this matter, and upon motion duly made, seconded and

passed, the Board finds the following:

5.

A. On March 7, 2017 patient MJJ brought her prescription for Methenamine

Hippurate to the Respondent to be refilled. Patient MJJ assert that the prescription, which was

for a count of 60 was filled partly with Methenamine Hippurate (a white pill) and partly with

Methenamine Mandelate (a blue pill). During the investigation, the Board's Investigator

determined that the Respondent's records did not correctly identify the person who filled and

labeled the medication bottle.

B. The Respondent's dispensing record indicates that Li Zeng, R.Ph filled the

aforementioned prescription on March 7, 2017 which was subsequently dispensed to patient

MJJ on March 8, 2017. Mr. Zeng was not on the schedule for March 7, 2017. During the

investigation, when asked about this discrepancy by the Board's Investigator, the Respondent's

Pharmacist-in-Charge responded that that the pharmacy staff did not always sign out of the

scale.

C. Patient MJJ has indicated that on April 22, 2017 she returned to Respondent and

advised a member of the pharmacy staff that she tolerated the blue pills better and requested

that the remaining white pills be exchanged. Patient MJJ has further indicated that on that date

Methenamine Mandelate was substituted for the remaining Methenamine Hippurate from the

March 7, 2017 prescription fill. Respondent has no record of this exchange and Respondent's

employees have no memory of it. Notwithstanding, on July 13, 2017, the Board's Inspector and

Respondent's Pharmacist-in-Charge found the pharmacy's inventory was short 60 tablets of

Methenamine Mandelate. During the investigation, the Board's Investigator was advised that

Respondent was not aware of the March 7, 2017 partial misfill until advised of it during the

Board's investigation.

D. The March 7, 2017 filling of patient MJJ's prescription for Methenamine

Hippurate partly with Methenamine Mandelate was a reportable incident as defined at K.S.A.

68-7-12b (a) ("Incident"). As a result, Respondent's involved Pharmacist and Pharmacist-in-

Charge were required by 68-7-12b to prepare an Incident Report that identified each pharmacy

employee involved in the Incident and thereafter have each involved employee sign the

Incident Report. Respondent's Incident Report failed to identify the employee who actually

filled the prescription.

6. Upon motion duly made, seconded and passed, the Board finds and concludes

that the events described in paragraph 5 above, constitute the operation of a pharmacy in a

manner that violates the Act and the Regulations of the Board and is therefore grounds for

disciplinary action against the Respondent's Kansas Registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627

(e)(1).

7. The Respondent agrees and consents and the Board finds concludes and orders

that the following disposition is just and appropriate under the circumstances:

A. REPORT TO THE BOARD. Within thirty (30) days of the Board

entering the Consent Order provided for herein, Respondent shall cause its then Pharmacist-in-

Charge to draft a detailed report to the Board explaining in as much detail as possible how the

events described in paragraph 5 hereof occurred. The report is to include details of the

Respondent's policies and procedures regarding identification of the staff person using the bar

code and scale technology.

B. CQI REPORT TO THE BOARD. Within 10 days of its completion or

the effective date of the Consent Order provided for herein, whichever is later, Respondent

shall cause its then Pharmacist-in-Charge to provide to the Board a copy of the Continuous

Quality Improvement Report, created in compliance with K.S.A. 65-1695, at which the

Incident was assessed.

C. OTHER REQUIREMENTS. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that

as a condition of this Stipulation and Consent Order it must, and the Board further orders the

Respondent to:

1. Comply fully with this Stipulation and Consent Order;

2. Comply fully with the Kansas Pharmacy Act, the Board's rules and

regulations and all state and federal laws relating to Kansas pharmacies;

8. Respondent agrees that all information in the possession of the Board's

Investigation Member, its staff, its investigators and or its attorney regarding the investigation

which lead to this disciplinary action and all information discovered during the pendency of the

disciplinary action may be disclosed to and considered by the Board as part of the presentation

and consideration of the proposal of settlement in the form of this Stipulation and Consent

Order and the Final Order provided for herein, with or without the presence of the Respondent

or its attorney. In the event that this Stipulation and Consent Order and the Final Order

provided for herein are not accepted and approved by the Board, the Respondent further waives

any objection to the Board members' consideration of this Stipulation and Consent Order or the

information mentioned in the preceding sentence and further agrees to waive any claim of due

process violation or the right to seek the disqualification of any Board member as a result of the

Board member's consideration of said document and information.

9. The stipulations contained herein shall not become binding until this Stipulation

and Consent Order is approved by the Board and the Final Order provided for herein is entered

by the Board. The Respondent acknowledges that the approval of the Board's Investigation

Member or its attorney shall not constitute the approval of the Board or bind the Board to

approve this Stipulation and Consent Order.

10. The Respondent agrees that this Stipulation and Consent Order is in

conformance with Kansas and federal law and the Board has jurisdiction to enter into it and

enter the Final Order provided for herein. The Respondent further agrees, for purposes of this

matter, that the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1626 et seq. is constitutional on its face and

as applied in this case.

11. This Stipulation constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and may only be

modified by a subsequent writing signed by them. The agreement shall be interpreted in

accordance with the laws of the State of Kansas.

12. The Respondent acknowledges that it has the following rights:

(a) To have formal notice of charges served upon it;

(b) To file a response to the charges;

(c) To have notice of and participate in a formal adjudicative hearing with the

Board or its designee making specific findings of facts and conclusions of law based only upon

evidence admitted at such hearing; and

(d) To take advantage of all applicable provisions of the Kansas

Administrative Procedures Act, K.S.A. 77-501 et seq. and the Kansas Judicial Review Act,

K.S.A. 77-601 et seq.

The Respondent freely waives these rights and acknowledges that said waiver is made

voluntarily and in consideration of the Board's limiting the disciplinary action taken against it

to those provided for herein. The Respondent further waives the right to seek reconsideration

or appeal or otherwise contest this Stipulation and Consent Order provided for herein.

13. The Respondent acknowledges that it enters into this Stipulation and Consent

Order freely and voluntarily after consultation with counsel of its choosing. The Respondent

further acknowledges that it has read this Stipulation and Consent Agency order in its entirety,

that it understands its legal consequences and that it agrees that none of its terms are

unconscionable, arbitrary or capricious.

14. Time is of the essence to this Stipulation and Consent Order. Respondent

acknowledges and agrees that any violation of this Stipulation and Consent Order shall

constitute a willful violation of a lawful Board order and grounds for further disciplinary action

against it. The pendency of any disciplinary action arising out of an alleged violation of this

Stipulation and Consent Order shall not affect the obligation of Respondent to comply with all

terms and conditions of this Stipulation and Consent Order.

15. This Stipulation and Consent Order constitutes the entire and final agreement of

the parties. In the event any provision of this Stipulation and Consent Order is deemed invalid

or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall be severed and the remaining

provisions of this Stipulation and Consent Order shall be given full force and effect.

16. Upon approval and entry of the Final Order by the Board, this Stipulation and

Consent Order shall be a public record in the custody of the Board.

17. This Stipulation and Consent Order shall become effective on the day it is approved, accepted and made an order of the Board by way of signature of the Board's authorized representative.

18. The Respondent acknowledges that it has been advised by the Board that it would have the right within 15 days after service of the Final Order provided for herein to file a petition for reconsideration with the Board and the right within 30 days after service of the Final Order provided for herein to file a petition for judicial review in the District Court of Shawnee County, Kansas in accordance with the Kansas Judicial Review Act, K.S.A. 77-601 et seq. and to serve such a petition for judicial review on the Kansas Board of Pharmacy by serving Alexandra Blasi, JD, MBS, its Executive Secretary at 800 SW Jackson St., Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612. The Respondent hereby waives those rights.
