I. Call to Order	Van Coble, RPh, called the meeting to order at 9:00am.
II. Approval of Minutes	The minutes from the September 9, 2022, meeting were approved. Mr. Bumgarner moved, seconded by Mr. Godwin.
III. 2023 Meeting Schedule	Ms. Donaldson shared the dates planned for meetings in 2023. Noted the July date may change.
IV. Regulations Update	Ms. Blasi provided a status update on the draft K-TRACS regulations. A public hearing is anticipated in early 2023. Ms. Blasi also provided an update on testimony provided to the Robert G. (Bob) Bethell Joint Committee on Home and Community Based Services and KanCare Oversight regarding the Office of Medicaid Inspector General's request for expanded law enforcement access to K-TRACS.
V. Program Update	Ms. Donaldson provided a program update on funding, implementation of Senate Bill 200 and the K-TRACS strategic plan.
VI. Guidance Document for Changes to Pharmacy Reporting	Ms. Donaldson provided an overview of a guidance document related to changes to how pharmacies report to K-TRACS. The document will be presented for adoption at the next meeting in January after further review.
VII. Case Review Criteria Revisions	Ms. Donaldson and Ms. Rice discussed a revision to the multiple provider episode threshold. The document will be presented for adoption at the next meeting in January after suggested edits.
VIII. Drug of Concern	Mr. Coble shared discovery of a drug of concern, Proin ER (Phenylpropanolamine hydrochloride) being prescribed for dogs and also available over the counter with concerns about it not being reported appropriately. Ms. Blasi suggested taking this information to the Board for review to determine if there is a legal or compliance gap.

The motion was approved. Mr. Heidrick abstained.</p> <p>Case 22-004 Dr. Davison moved, Mr. Godwin seconded to send a letter to the provider acknowledging receipt of her response and to dismiss the case. The motion was approved.</p> <p>Case 22-005 Dr. Davison moved, Mr. Godwin seconded to send a letter to the provider and the supervising physician acknowledging receipt of their response and to dismiss the case. The motion was approved.</p>
