## **SUMMARY ORDER**

NOW on this 22nd day of May, 2024, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Director, the matter of Alliance Rehab & Medical Equipment LLC. ("Respondent").

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, et seq., and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, et seq., the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the investigation materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Board has previously issued Respondent Registration No. 16-109192 which entitles Respondent to operate as a durable medical equipment provider in the State of Kansas ("Respondent's Registration").
- 2. Respondent's Registration was originally issued April 8, 2019, and was annually renewed by Respondent on May 23, 2022 and June 30, 2023.
- 3. On March 22, 2024, the Board's Inspector attempted to conduct an inspection of Respondent's facility located at 9907 Pflumm Rd, Lenexa, Kansas ("Old Address"). Upon arriving, the Inspector observed "Marquee Creatives" business signage on the exterior glass of the

entry door and conducted an online search for Respondent's facility, finding an address at 9908 Pflumm Rd, Lenexa, Kansas ("New Address"). The Inspector drove to the new location and observed Respondent's signage on the front glass. The front entry door was locked, the Inspector knocked for entry without a response, and then looked through the front glass and open mini blinds to see Respondent's Registration posted on the south interior wall.

- 4. On April 9, 2024, the Board received from Respondent a Form BA-16 Durable Medical Equipment Registration Application, notifying of the change in address to the New Address and applying for a new durable medical equipment registration at the New Address. The effective date of change was cut off on the Application and not legible.
- 5. On May 10, 2024, the Board sent Respondent an email requesting clarification of the effective date of change for Respondent moving to the New Address. Respondent responded to the email and indicated the effective date was April 1, 2022.
- 6. On May 15, 2024, the Board approved Respondent's Durable Medical Equipment Provider Application, effective immediately.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, the Board may assess a civil fine not to exceed \$5,000, after notice and an opportunity to be heard, to any registrant for violation of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any other rules or regulations of the state board of pharmacy.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(f)(6), the Board may take action against the application of any durable medical equipment provider upon a finding that the applicant has violated the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any regulation adopted by the Board.

3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1643(m), it shall be unlawful for any person to sell or lease

or offer for sale or lease durable medical equipment without first obtaining a registration from the

Board.

4. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1645(f), registrations issued pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1643

shall not be transferrable and shall expire every year.

5. By continuing to operate as a wholesale distributor at the New Address using the

registration issued to the Old Address, Respondent violated K.S.A. 65-1643 and 65-1645, which

is a basis to impose discipline against Respondent's Registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(f)(6).

6. Respondent's overt act of renewing Respondent's Registration issued to the Old

Address on May 23, 2022 and June 30, 2023, despite moving to the New Address and beginning

operating in April 2022, is a violation of K.S.A. 65-1643 and 65-1645, which is a basis to impose

discipline against Respondent's Registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(f)(6).

7. Respondent's failure to submit the complete change of address application to the

Board until April 9, 2024 – almost two years after the effective date of change – and continuing to

operate without a valid registration is a basis to discipline Respondent's Registration pursuant to

K.S.A. 65-1627(f)(6).

<u>ORDER</u>

The Board finds and concludes that Respondent's conduct, as described above, violates the

Act and such conduct warrants the imposition of a fine pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, in the amount

of \$1,500. Respondent has 30 days from the date of this order to pay the full amount due.

**NOTICES** 

The Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

SUMMARY ORDER

1. The Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson,

Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final

order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a

petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial

review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive
