## SUMMARY ORDER OF DENIAL

NOW on this <u>I</u> day of April, 2018, comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the "Board"), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Janice Allen, ("Applicant"), for her application for registration as a Kansas pharmacy technician.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board's Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order of Denial in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the application materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order.

## **FINDINGS OF FACT**

For purposes of this order, the Board's Executive Secretary makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. On December 19, 2017, the Board received Applicant's application for registration as a pharmacy technician in the State of Kansas ("Applicant's Application").
- 2. Applicant answered "No" to the following question on her application: "Have you been charged with or convicted of (includes plea of guilty or no contest) a criminal offense or is there any criminal charge now pending against you (other than minor traffic violations) in

any state or federal court whether or not a sentence was imposed, suspended, or diverted? This includes misdemeanors."

- 3. Applicant's Application materials indicate the following charges:
  - a. 2007 Theft
  - b. 2007 Bad Check
- 4. On December 19, 2017, the Board sent Applicant a letter requesting she submit a completed S-150 Form to address the undisclosed charge.
- 5. On January 30, 2018 the Board sent Applicant a second request letter requesting she submit a completed S-150 Form to address the undisclosed charge.
- 6. On March 20, 2018 the Board sent Applicant a final request letter requesting she submit a completed S-150 Form to address the undisclosed charge.
- 7. To-date, Applicant has not responded to the Board's requests for a completed S-150 Form or any other correspondence.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. That pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1663, the Board may limit, suspend, or revoke a registration or deny an application for issuance or renewal of any registration as a pharmacy technician on any ground which would authorize the board to take action against the license of a pharmacist under K.S.A. 65-1627, and amendments thereto.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(2) the Board may deny the granting of a license to an Applicant who has been convicted of a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude or any felony and the licensee fails to show that the licensee has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust;

- 3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(3), the Board may deny the granting of a license to an Applicant who has been found by the Board to be guilty of unprofessional conduct.
- 4. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1626(sss)(7), unprofessional conduct means conduct likely to deceive or harm the public.
- 5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(15), the Board may deny an application from an Applicant who has failed to furnish the board, its investigators or its representatives any information legally requested by the board;
- 6. Applicant's multiple arrests involving offenses of deceipt, and the failure to show that Applicant has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust, are bases to deny Applicant's Application pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a).
- 7. Applicant's failure to respond to the Board's S-150 request is a basis to deny Applicant's Application pursuant to 65-1627(a)(15).
- 8. Applicant's history of criminal behavior poses a danger to the public in the pharmacy setting, and is a basis to deny Applicant's Application.

#### **ORDER**

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Applicant's Application for issuance of pharmacy technician registration is hereby DENIED.

#### NOTICES

Applicant is hereby notified as follows:

9. Applicant may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

10. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order denying Applicant's Registration as a pharmacy technician shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

11. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

12. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is
